Merry Christmas and welcome to the December issue of the Huby Voice.

You'll notice that it's somewhat thicker than usual, thanks to the inclusion of a questionnaire on the future of the village shop and Post Office.

David and his family are keen to secure its future for the long-term benefit of all in both Huby and Sutton, by ensuring that the shop becomes community-run.

The next step to making this a reality is gathering feedback about the shop, hence the questionnaire. Following this there will be a public meeting early next year with a view to setting up a committee to oversee the process from thereon.

We have a terrific example of how such a venture can succeed down the road in Stillington, where the shop has been community-owned for over 10 years. The team there have already been incredibly supportive of the efforts thus far in Huby and we will benefit from their experience.

The Stillington experience shows that it requires large-scale support of the community to work, and so we are faced with the opportunity for the whole village to unite behind a common goal.

Turnout at the recent Parish Council meeting suggests that support is there, but the response to the questionnaire will give the first real indication of the desire of the community at large.

So, ask yourself 'Do I value having a village shop and Post Office?'. If the answer is 'Yes' then please act now, complete the questionnaire and drop it in at the shop. It will also be great to see you at the meeting in January. Until then, Merry Christmas!

The business has been up for lease since the spring without a suitable lease been agreed. David, Lesley and Family have always been keen on the idea of making the store '**community run**'. This would not only secure the future of the shop, but would be a lasting legacy of Lesley's and David's service and dedication over the past 26 years.

This exciting opportunity has now arisen and **now is the time for change!** Although we have had some very good advice and guidance from experienced people we now need the **help & support of local residents to make this happen and keep 'the heart of the village' running for many years to come.**

This plan has now been discussed at both Huby and Sutton Parish Council meetings where **we received a very positive response.** Taking professional advice, the next step is to carry out a questionnaire to establish what the local community want for the future of the Village Shop & Post Office. How sewage pumping station ownership is changing

Changes in the law mean that from 1st October 2016 all water and sewerage companies will take over the responsibility of private sewage pumping stations.

Which pumping stations will transfer?

Only certain pumping stations will be eligible for transfer—generally the privately owned pumping stations which serve more than one property and connect to the existing public sewer network.

How are we informing customers?

We're keen to know about all private pumping stations so we've started a campaign asking customers to report them to us by calling

0345 1 24 24 24

What do they look like?

They could be on a housing estate or in a customer's garden. Some are on the roadside or verges. Usually they have a green metal kiosk which houses the control equipment. You might also notice a metal cover on the ground which sits on top of an underground chamber called a "wet well". The wet well contains the pump(s) and collects the sewage before it's pumped to our main sewers.

How can you help?

You can help inform people about the changes in ownership and encourage them to report their pumping stations to us as soon as possible. We don't know the location of hundreds of pumping stations so we're relying on people reporting them to us. We'll then check whether its eligible for transfer.

On a balmy Mid-Summers Eve with Hog Roast t'boot the Marquees and Pavilion were soon thronged with nearly two hundred revellers making merry and dancing the night away to local band "Hello Operator".

Feast Day was to follow on Sunday 22nd June and after several years of inclement weather we were at last blessed with wall to wall sunshine for our big day. This year's Feast was without doubt the biggest to-date with attractions spanning the whole cricket field.

As usual children were heavily catered for. On arrival they were greeted by our very own pesky mascot Huey the Huby Hare with his band of high-jinx and tricks. WonderPhil entertained throughout the afternoon with his zany comedy sketches and entertainments to be found around the site included Traditional Amusements, Miniature Train, Bucking Bronco and Forest Quest. Other children's attractions included Treasure Hunt, Face Painting, Ponies, Story Telling, Cooking Demonstrations by the Mended Drum and the century old tradition of Children's Races led by our very own Brownies.

Music is always high on the agenda at Huby Feast and this year was no exception. Annual favourites are Dynamics with their big brass

sound and Gary Hall with his lovely Fairground Organs. One of the highlights this year were Four Hundred Roses dancing their unique fusion of tribal belly dance and UK folk styles ably assisted by their own Morris musicians "The Thorns".

No Feast would be complete without its fine selection of food which this year ranged from Argentinean Steak Burgers, Caribbean delights to our own local delicacy, the Hog Roast!

Admission to the Feast, as always, is free with the main intention being that the committee not only provide all villagers with a fun packed free day but also give all clubs, societies and groups in the village the ideal opportunity to bolster their coffers by using the Feast as a great fund raising vehicle. Many clubs took advantage of this opportunity, but special mention must go to the Sports Committee and New Hall Sub Group who between them raised over £2000, once again emphasising the great desire by the majority in the village for first class social and sporting facilities in our village.

The whole weekend proved to be a great success, the Scarecrow Challenge was well supported, the help and assistance given to the Feast Committee over Feast Week was greatly appreciated and the Dance and Feast Day had their biggest attendances to-date which in turn created a fantastic community atmosphere at both events.

From a personal point of view, after six years, this was my last year in the Chair and so I would just like to thank the previous committee for having the foresight to resurrect this great village tradition, the current committee for all their hard work and dedication and to all in our community who have taken the time to support the Feast in every way over the past years. Long may it continue.

Trev’s Growing Tips For Winter

Outside

- Finish gathering leaves
- Keep fallen leaves out of ponds
- Leave corners of the garden untouched for wildlife
- Harvest root crops
- Spread well-rotted manure on empty veg beds
- Cover non-hardy shrubs with fleece
- Check homemade compost; dig into beds when ready
- Put up nest boxes
- Remove snow from shrubs etc both its weight snaps/splits any branches

Indoor jobs for a cold/rainy day

- Clean and tidy the greenhouse
- Sort out seed packets & make a note of what you’ve got, so as not to over stock
- Wash pots/seed trays
- Clean & oil equipment to store for next season
- Look through seed catalogues and start ordering for next season
- January: order seed potatoes/onion sets
- Check stored fruit and vegetables & remove any that are soft/rotten
- Enjoy your seasonal indoor plants such as amaryllis, poinsettia, bulbs in containers eg tete a tete narcissus
- Don’t forget to recycle any living Christmas trees in the New Year

Recipe: Easy Choc Truffles

INGREDIENTS

- 100g dark choc
- 275g icing sugar
- 100g unsalted butter
- cocoa powder
- Optional brandy 1tsp
- choc vermicelli
- Petit four cases

METHOD

- Put broken choc pieces

- choc into heatproof bowl and melt
- over pan of simmering water nb: not too hot, or too long
- Soften butter in mixing bowl with wooden spoon
- Mix in sieved icing sugar and melted choccie
- Add optional brandy
- Shape the mixture into small balls with a teaspoon

- Roll the balls in cocoa powder, or vermicelli
- Place into petit four cases
- Put into decorative boxes/cellophane bags.
