## **NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL**

The Annual Parish meeting was a success this year when it was held in the Memorial Village Hall with food and refreshments provided. A large number of groups attended the event which was informal and gave groups an opportunity to showcase themselves. The Parish Council will be repeating the event next year and would like to see increased numbers of groups and individuals attending.

The Parish Council is keen to encourage groups and organisations to access grant funding that is available. We have allocated a portion of our budget to provide match funding on grants for projects in the village. We are keen hear from other groups who are looking for match funding for grants. For further details please contact the clerk or any Parish Councillor.

The Neighbourhood plan group continue to work on some areas of the plan. A consultation will be held before the end of the year showing how the plan is progressing. The plan is however waiting for the outcome of the appeal inquiry in December which could take another six months. This depends upon the Secretary of State signing off the decision which may not be considered a high priority in an election year.

It is concerning that a number of groups are finding it hard to attract volunteers. As a small community we rely on individuals giving their time for the good of the community. Please consider how you may be able to give your time to allow events which you may have taken for granted to continue.

At the Parish Council meeting in September we agreed to review the Public Open Space, Sports and Recreation plan. All groups will be contacted who have control or access to Open Space by the clerk in the coming weeks. We would like to see all ideas brought forward. This is very much a wish list for the next twenty years. An example would be improved drainage on the Playing fields or better seating around the village. With this in place it will be easier to identify grant opportunities. The Parish Council is to add projects for Tally Hill and the other small areas of common land.

## HUBY CRICKET CLUB

With one game of the season remaining both teams sit fifth in their respective leagues. The first team, led by Thomas Piercy competed in division 3 North and relied on a relatively settled and experienced side. Notable performances came with an excellent winning draw against a very strong Easingwold side with Sam Peel making a superb 91 not out, and good wins versus Easingwold and local rivals Stillington.

Disappointments came in a heavy defeat by Sheriff Hutton Bridge second-team and York Fourth team.

Notable individual performances came from Rob Steel who made 80 versus Drax including six fours and seven sixes and Daniel Grainger taking five for 20, Hugh Shedden scoring 62 out of a total of 118 versus Sessay, versus Woodhouse Grange Dan Grainger made 90 and Tom Piercy 72, Shaun Dixon collected 62 versus New Earswick and at Malton and Old Malton Hugh Shedden claimed 5 for 24.

The batting lineup was led by Daniel Grainger 357 runs at an average of 25.5 Sean Dixon 385 runs at an average of 38.5 Chris Cundall 234 runs at an average of 29.35 and Thomas Piercy 418 runs at an average of 27.87. The experienced bowling attack saw Daniel Grainger take 25 wickets at an average of 18.84, Hugh Shedden 20 at 15.55 and Mark Swales 15 at 26.89. At no time did heads drop and the team played for each other and showed great respect to the opposition.

The second team competed in division Four Central and in only their second season in the senior league were led by Darren Howell. By contrast this was an extremely youthful team with a small core of older heads. Due to the relative inexperience of the team there were bound to be disappointments and a first day defeat to Cawood (their only win of the season) and heavy losses to Hovingham, Osbaldwick, Civil Service and the champions Copmanthorpe were to be expected. However there were also some superb performances, a maiden century by Sam Peel saw local rivals Sheriff Hutton overcome, twice Duncombe Park were beaten from losing positions the second being the first time that the side had chased down over 200, Civil Service who are currently second in the league were defeated by eight wickets but most notably a championship winning Copmanthorpe side who won every other

game they played this season were comfortably dispatched. However perhaps the most remarkable performance came at home versus Dringhouses where at 9 AM the club had only seven players and looked likely to concede the match, but after several frantic phone calls three more teenagers were signed and an unlikely draw gained leaving the captain watching on from the balcony with a wide smile on his face and a pint in his hand. The batting was led by old hands Mike South 335 runs at 41.88 Darren Howell 366 runs at 40.66 and Mike Rickatson 84 runs at 42, that is not to say that youngsters did not feature with Ollie Tanner-Smith playing the only innings of substance at Cawood and a cameo helped win the match at Duncombe Park even though he was cruelly run out by his father, and 13-year-old Joe Wright began the season at number 11 but the second half of the season saw him opening and playing a number of mature innings. The bowling attack was an almost exclusively teenage affair with Flynn Burgess aged 14 taking 11 wickets at 9.73 James Pocklington 15-years-old taking 11 wickets at 27.73 and Ollie Tanner Smith 14 years old also taking 11 wickets at 38, Joe Wright 13 weighed with 19 wickets at an average of 13.79. Indeed 10 of the bowlers used this season are not yet allowed to vote. This has been a magnificent season for the second team with all the other youngsters also gaining valuable experience and all the games were played in great spirit.

On the pitch the cricket club is in rude health and the ground is in excellent condition. Usually the first and second team are picking from a large squad allowing the club to loan players to other clubs who struggle with sufficient numbers to generate a side. There will over the next couple of years be a number of second-teamers looking to push on into the first team and that is no bad thing for the club. There is a great camaraderie between the first team and the second team and also between the younger and older players. The New Inn provided superb teas (you had to be quick to claim a piece of chocolate cake if Mike South was playing)! Everybody is looking forward to 2015, hopefully with the news that a new facility can be provided for the village and the club, that will allow us to entertain our opposition in a fashion that befits Huby.

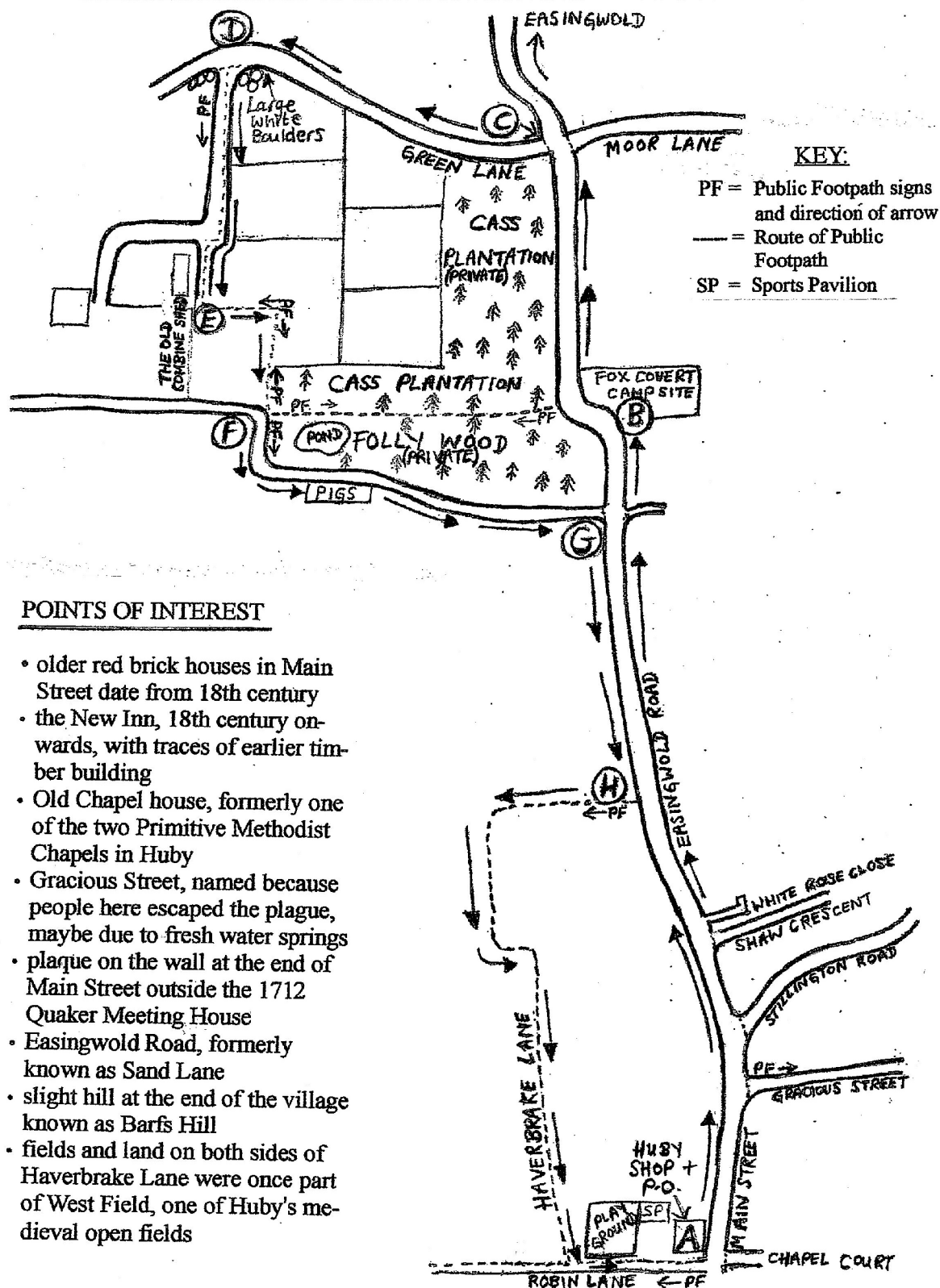
Following interest expressed via the Neighbourhood Plan consultation events, a group of local residents have been meeting regularly over the past few months to investigate walks in and around Huby.

## Trev's Growing Tips Autumn/Winter

### Outside

- Gather up leaves & store to make leaf mould to use as mulch/add to compost
- Leave corners of the garden untouched for wildlife
- Tidy up borders/beds
- Harvest root crops
- Spread well-rotted manure on empty veg beds
- Cover non-hardy shrubs with fleece
- Lift & store corms over winter eg gladioli

### Indoor jobs for a cold/rainy day

- Clean and tidy the greenhouse
- Sort out seed packets & make a note of what you've got, so as not to over stock
- Wash pots/seed trays
- Clean & oil equipment to store for next season
- Look through seed catalogues and start ordering for next season
- Enjoy your seasonal indoor plants such as amaryllis, poinsettia, bulbs in containers eg tete a tete narcissus
- Make plans for your living Christmas tree!

## Recipe: Prizewinning Marmalade

### Ingredients

- 2lb seville oranges\*
- 1 lemon 4lb granulated sugar
- 4 pints water 6 X 1lb jars
- (Plus wax discs & lids)
- 23cm square of gauze/muslin/string



### Method

Measure water into preserving pan  
Cut fruit in half & squeeze out juice & add juice to water  
Place pips & pith onto muslin square  
Cut peel orange peel into quarters, and quarter again and then into thinnish strands with a sharp knife/scissors  
Add strands to water & pith etc to muslin  
Tie up muslin into a bag and attach to handle of pan with string. Make sure it is suspended in the water.  
Bring liquid up to simmering point and

simmer gently & uncovered for about 2hrs until peel is soft  
Remove bag of pips & put on a saucer  
Pour sugar into pan & stir it now & then over a low heat until dissolved  
Now increase to high heat  
Squeeze all “goo” out of muslin bag and whisk into the pan (The jelly like substance contains the pectin)  
When a fast boil is reached start timing. After 15mins test for a set.  
If not then return to boil & retest every 10 mins.  
Scum can be dispersed by stirring in half tsp of butter, or spooning off. Leave to settle for 20mins then jar up into warm jars.  
Cover with wax seal & lid.  
Label. Enjoy!

*Note: \*Short availability season Jan/Feb, so why not get extra and freeze them to use later in the year*
