***Ricki which is your favourite ale that you've been able to source?***

To be honest I can't pick just one, we are working with some great breweries like ATOM and BRASS CASTLE where you can't get have a bad pint! The one I'm most looking forward to is the breakfast IPA Assam and marmalade tea. This said I am so excited about our winter beer festival where we will have 15 hand pulls at any one time.

***Lisa tell us about your Gin Club***

Gin Club is making Thursday my favourite day of the week! Where you can have any premium gin and tonic for £4.00 and now with our Steak Night addition

where you can get 2 steaks for £15.00; it's a great night of the week! I adore my gin and love learning about the weird and wonderful flavour pairing you can do! Although Ricki winces when he's sees the invoice!!



***Why have you chosen to source food ingredients and beers locally?***

There is so much amazing produce and passion for food and ale here we couldn't have decided not to use this resource! As Ricki likes to tell me regularly everything is better when it's Yorkshire !! I have to agree we have even started to source local spirits including Masons Yorkshire gin.

***What's happening at The Drum over Christmas and New Year?***

We have a beer festival 27-29th Nov, live music. We have a full pub take over by ATOM 11th December where we will be handing over the bar, restaurant and kitchen to the ATOM guys, what could possibly go wrong!!! We are having a charity night on the 22nd December for testicular cancer where we are having a race night and dart knock out match. For us Christmas and new year is a time to have fun at the drum. We love the community and family side of this time of year and love being part of it!!!

We adore our new life in Huby and love what we do! We have raised nearly £2000 for local causes and charities in a year, but we couldn't do any of this without the amazing people here!!! For us the village pub is a hub of the community we've had birthdays, christenings, charity nights, stag dos, engagement parties there was even a space hopper competition!

## Recycling Update from Hambleton District Council

### Mini Recycling Centre Removal

As you know part of the Waste Services Review that will bring in increased kerbside recycling systems for all Hambleton residents, sees the mini recycling centres around the district removed. We will be writing to all the properties that this affects – in your area it is: Huby Primary School. They are being told that following the comprehensive waste services review there will be significant changes to the recycling services - from March 1st 2016 all households will receive a third wheeled bin for recycling materials which will include all materials collected at the above site/s and more. In March 2016 all mini recycling banks will be removed across the District - the new kerbside recycling scheme will be taking all the materials currently collected at the sites. We will be advertising the closure of these sites to inform residents – through the website, press releases and signage at the affected sites and letters to the Parish Councils. Schools and Village Halls will be offered the same service as households (although in the form of 2 x 240litre wheeled bins).

It is with great sadness that I note the passing of a past chairman and stalwart of Huby Neighbourhood Watch: Peter Lyddon (Major Lyddon MBE) sadly passed away in October this year. A fellow member of the Neighbourhood Watch for nearly 8 years and an active member of the community. The Huby Neighbourhood Watch was formed in December 1993, with Peter joining in 2005 & becoming its chairman in 2007; a position he held until 2012. Peter for many years organised the Christmas village patrols, ensuring that there was a high visible presence to deter thieves. He also initiated Watch members to deliver and produce the village paper; this responsibility was subsequently passed on to the Parish Council. He is a great loss to the village; the Neighbourhood Watch members offer their condolences to Peter's family and mourn his passing.

## CHILDREN'S PLANT COMPETITION

We appreciate the continuing support from Peacock Garden Design in the planning and execution of the annual competition judged at the show. Now a month earlier than in the past pupils will have to be ready to start growing their plants and designing plant pots straight after the Easter holiday!



## Trev's Growing Tips

### Things to do in the garden now...

- Gather leaves to make mulch: Collect the leaves when they are thoroughly saturated to aid quick decomposition. Use as a potting compost, soil improver or a mulch.
- Tidy up borders: chop up, or shred as much material as possible and add to the compost heap.
- Give agapanthus shelter: they like it cool and dry during their dormant season.
- Wash pots ready for next year
- Spread well-rotted manure on empty veg plots
- Cover non-hardy shrubs with fleece if hard frosts are likely.
- Clean your mower being storing away for winter!
- Why not provide high-energy food for the birds?
- Why not try to grow a new crop such as garlic?

## LAVENDERS & PINKS

September's meeting was well received and all listened attentively to Gill Tomkinson entertain us with an interesting and lively talk on how to grow these popular plants:

- They hate damp and so plant with grit for free drainage.
- English lavenders are tolerant to -15° C
- "Little Lottie" a very pretty rosy pink plant, height 8 X 12" Plant at the front of a border, or a pot, or window ledge
- "Nana Alba" miniature white 8 X 12"
- "Diane" popular
- "Blue Scent" (Elegance series) Tough, super for attracting bees & other insects, hated by deer, two successions of flowers, 12 X 12"
- Little Bee Series: hard to acquire, bred for bees, an English lavender, but with "French" flowers
- "Falgate": excellent for cooking & migraines
- "Long Pink" 3' tall. Great lining the path of a cottage garden
- "Hidcote Pink" – "Edelweiss" is a beautiful white variety
- "Spanish Eyes": use as an annual, lemon scent, grow from seed (2yrs to get a good plant)
- "Bracken Hall": tall and tough, excellent for semi-dappled shade
- HEDGING: eg Grey Ledge, Munsted, Hidcote

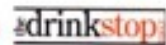

## Huby Primary School Results in top 2% of the country!



Primary school was thrilled to receive a letter from Nick HubyGibb. Minister of State for School Reform, congratulating them on their very high standard of

achievement in the 2015 Phonics screening check, that all children in Year 1 nationally take. 100% of pupils passed the screening check which meant that Huby school is in the top 2% of all schools in the country. The school is delighted by this result and the fact that they have been consistently above national averages since the phonics check was introduced. The teaching of reading at Huby is given the highest priority and this was recognised by Ofsted in June 2015 who stated reading was 'outstanding' at Huby. Many thanks to all the parents at Huby who regularly listen to their children read and support the school in this valuable way.

## Out and about!

All the children have had a busy first half term extending their learning outside of the classroom. The children in Years 3 and 4 visited Eden



Camp as part of their topic on World War 2. They spent the day exploring the sights, sounds and smells of living in Britain during



World War 2, experiencing the living conditions of life on a U boat to hearing and seeing the sights and sounds of living through the Blitz and the evenings spent in Anderson Shelters.

Children in Year 5 and 6 honed their geo-caching and map skills and undertook river investigations on the



River Esk as part of their geography field work at Danby Moor on the North York Moors. Luckily the weather was excellent and the children had a wonderful day.

Our youngest children also were out and about and the children in Early Years went on their first school trip to Harlow Carr Gardens in Harrogate. All the children in Early Years and Years 1 and 2 explored the gardens and sculptures, whilst spending the morning looking at different seeds and planting their own lettuce leaves. Their green fingers have paid off and the children will soon be eating their leaves!



The children's behaviour on all three trips was exceptional and staff, children and parent volunteers all thoroughly enjoyed themselves.
