Parish News

The Parish Council has now been able to have two meetings face to face which has been a great relief after so many Zoom meetings. Let us hope that it continues. No members of the public had yet been present, everyone is welcome back if they feel comfortable. There is still just one vacancy on the Council. If anyone would like to be considered for co-option, please do email me.

Ten planning applications have been considered since the last newsletter. The Council also met with Jon Berry, the Head of Planning at Hambleton District Councils. Discussion was around how the Parish Council can best influence the outcome of planning decisions. Jon reiterated the importance of a Neighbourhood Plan, and the Council will consider in September whether to resurrect the production of a plan. This would be produced by a separate committee and anyone wishing to be involved please contact the Council.

News came through about the introduction of a Unitary Authority. A new North Yorkshire wide authority will take over the roles of the Districts and County Council from April 2023. Elections for the Councillors for this new authority will take place. No changes will be made to Parish Councils.

A new larger notice board is now in place. This will allow both Parish Council and Community notices to be put up without conflicting. The old board has a new lease of life at the Village Hall.

The Council is requesting that Tree Preservation Orders be made on the trees in Tally Hill and one in Haverbrakes Lane. However there appears to be a wider appreciation of existing trees in the village and if anyone has any suggestions of trees that should be protected, please contact the Council. Two dead trees on Main Street will be replaced by cherry trees at the appropriate time.

The Council is obtaining two new additional benches to be placed on Tally Hill. It also has three benches that need refurbishment. Anyone who would like to tender for the installation refurbishment please contact the Council.

The Council agreed two grants, one of £1,000 to help with the running costs of the Playground and the other of £1,400 to help fund a Community Event in September. It is great to know that community events and activities are back with us after so long.

You will by now have most likely seen the Speed Warning signs in the village which are intended to remind motorists of the 30mph speed limit. There is one on Bell Lane and one near Barf Hill. The signs are moveable and will be relocated from time to time to monitor speeds at various places. The signs collect data which can be analysed to statistics about the volume and speed of vehicles through Surprisingly, over 1000 vehicles per day pass the sign at Bell Lane, and nearly 900 per day at Barf Hill. The data shows that about 85% of drivers are obeying the speed limit, and thus keeping the village safe. However, this does mean that about 15% of vehicles travel through the village too fast. Some are just over the limit, but a few are significantly exceeding the posted speed limit. Huby is a busy village with a high volume of traffic. Observing the speed limit helps keep the village safer for all users.

PLEASE will you help us by returning the User Evidence forms to us, if you use this lane. 100 have been issued but some have not been returned. We need enough to go to the County Council to make a strong case. Please fill in the correct lane, Brownmoor Lane, on the map, otherwise we cannot use the form. You can return them to Kathryn Wallis (Cariss House), the Evers (Rose Cottage) or to the shop. We also have spare forms for anyone else to fill in.

We are well on collecting historic documents and maps, which have to go to NYCC too.

If we do not complete this task, then we will lose any rights to use Brownmoor Lane.

Forms for Oxclose Lane and Sparrington Lane will follow.

Tuesday 28 September: Nomadland

McDormand (an Oscar winning performance) stars as Fern, a widow and former substitute teacher in Empire, Nevada – a town wiped off the map by a factory closure – who is forced into piling some possessions into a tatty van and heading off, something she accepts with an absolute lack of self-pity. The people she meets on the road are, mostly, real nomads who have vivid presences on screen and McDormand's modest, equable persona slots easily into this group.

Chloé Zhao's Nomadland (best film at the Oscars) is an utterly inspired docu-fictional hybrid, like her previous feature <u>The Rider</u>. It is a gentle, compassionate, questioning film about the American soul.



Tuesday 2 November: Samba

Samba is a 2014 French <u>comedy-drama</u> film cowritten and directed by <u>Éric Toledano and</u>
Olivier Nakache. It is their second collaboration with actor <u>Omar Sy</u> following <u>The</u>
Intouchables (2012). You may also have seen him in Lupin.

Samba Cissé (Sy), a migrant from Senegal to France, works as a dish washer in a hotel. After a bureaucratic slip-up lands him in detention, he is ordered to leave France. With the help of a businesswoman (<u>Charlotte Gainsbourg</u>), he fights to stay in France.

Sy and Gainsbourg do a great job of lending depth and complexity to their characters, while Tahar Rahim is a hoot as Samba's allegedly Brazilian best friend.

2Ks Walk the Wall




