Parish Council News

There is still just one vacancy on the Council. If anyone would like to be considered for cooption, please do email me.

Five planning applications have been considered since the last newsletter. The Council will in March be meeting with Hambleton DC regarding restarting the Neighbourhood Plan process and also designating a Conservation Area. This would give the parish much more protection from inappropriate development which would impact on the nature of the village.

Two grants have been granted by the Parish Council. One for £450 to the Huby Bowling Club towards a diesel generator and £2,615 to the Village Hall towards its cost of repairing the porch roof.

An order has now been laid before Parliament detailing the new warding arrangements for the unitary authority. The parish is expected to be in a new Huby & Tollerton ward. It is also expected that the parish council elections will be brought forward to May next year.

The two new benches for Tally Hill have now been installed. The new bench near the children's play area has been received and has permission from the sports field committee. Once the demolition work is fully completed the bench will be fitted.

The next meeting of the Council will be held on Monday 7 March at 7.30pm in the village hall.

Thursday 21 April



Huby & Sutton Gardening Club

It's more than likely that you've heard of the sudden death of our Chairman, Willie Anderson on 1st October.



Willie was the Gardening Club. He took over the Club when had only 20 members. Their subs would scarcely cover the cost of a speaker and the hall hire. He was instrumental in encouraging members from Huby to join, by holding alternate meetings there. In addition, he recruited people from nearby clubs that have closed to join. As a result, we now have more than 80 members and a bank balance. He encouraged the Club to organise Opens Gardens and did a lot of the work himself. These events have raised tens of thousands of pounds for charities serving the York area and for village good causes. Local children were encouraged into gardening with potato growing and pelargonium competitions. He had no-nonsense Scottish manner, encouraging numerous locals, often not members to help, in a way they found impossible to resist.

At the request of the Committee, I have accepted the Chairmanship of the Club, but Willie will be a very hard act to follow so I hope members will forgive any lapse in standards.

Our meetings in 2022 as usual, alternate between Sutton and Huby village halls and start at 7.45. They are advertised on the notice boards of both villages and members are reminded by e-mail. You can join at any meeting and so obtain concessions from several local gardening goods suppliers or just come as a visitor.

Volunteering is good for you and your community!

A few months ago, Barkers of Huby was visited by assessors for the Queens Awards for Voluntary Service and they were taken aback by the shop, the range of produce and the amazing volunteers who keep



the shop open 7 days a week. The shop has over 50 volunteers and all of them have interesting back stories about why they have got involved: to put something back, to keep connected, learn new skills and meet like-minded people and make new friends.

Graham and Lynda Jones are two of our volunteers, they had got to know Barkers of Huby from stopping by on their house-hunting trips and always thought it was a great feature of the village. Recent retirees, they moved to Huby in September 2019.

"We hadn't been here long before Janet in the Post Office said we should volunteer because it was a good way of getting to know people. Someone else pointed out that the shop was a great place to pick up the village gossip – or start the gossip if we wanted to!"

"We'd enjoyed volunteering for things in the past, so decided we could do an hour or two a week. We gave ourselves a few months to settle in and signed up early in 2020. That was shortly before the first lockdown when the shop became a lifeline for the village. Suddenly we were busy with shifts in the shop plus shopping for people shielding, but that way we got to know more people more quickly than we would have done otherwise."

"It's been good to learn new skills like how to operate a till, and it's fun meeting the cross-section of Huby/Sutton residents and passers-by who use the shop, especially when there's chance for a chat. And it means when we pass people in the street, we often know them from seeing them in the shop. We've also made some good friends among the other volunteers and enjoyed the volunteer socials."

The shop is a great asset to Huby and Sutton and it's good to be playing a small part in keeping it going."

Whilst the shop does have a great team of volunteers, we are keen to encourage more local people to get involved and share the load. It can be for a couple of hours a week but is flexible so there's no sense of obligation to always do a certain time, etc. And as well as serving in the shop, there are other roles where more hands are always welcome, like picking up stock, bits and pieces of light DIY and maintenance. All volunteers are made very welcome, with training, lots of support and a buddy at the beginning. We also do regular volunteer socials, and of course you hear the odd bit of news first over the shop counter!

Help with Electricity Price Rises

We've all heard the recent headlines about increasing electricity prices and the stark choices many people will have to make. Few of us know exactly how this will affect us and if you find you are struggling, please remember that the Surviving Winter Fund is there to help you now – not just in Winter.

All Hallows Church and Easingwold Food Bank set up the Surviving Winter Fund to help residents in the Parish with fuel costs, but no one realised then what increases were coming. The fund is made up of contributions from people who receive the annual Government Winter Fuel payment to over 65s but feel they do not need their payment so look to donate it. The fund is not just available in winter though – you can access it anytime of the year if you need help.

How can we be sure that beneficiaries are truly in need? Due to the complete confidentiality of the fund, only Frank from the Food Bank, and sometimes the vicar, will know who the recipients are. We ask that you believe us when we say people do not ask for help easily. It takes courage and true need to approach a food bank for help; and Frank's experience of working with people in the area gives him an understanding of need and how to encourage people to accept offers of help.

We've had a really busy start to 2022. The children have been enjoying a variety of experiences to enrich their academic studies.




We started the term with a Times Tables Rockstars Day. The children (and staff) dressed up and took part in a day of maths competitions and activities. Multiplication is the main tool for many forms of maths such as algebra, fractions, equations and

more. The ability to rehearse and understand multiplications up to and including 12 by the end of Year 4 of primary school, enables children to confidently and skilfully tackle more complex mathematical concepts.

This term, the children in Owls' Classes (Year 3 and 4) are learning about the Romans in history. In January, they visited Murton Park where they were able to experience life in the Roman times first hand.
