Parish Council News

The permission from the Secretary of State for permission to borrow from the Public Works Loan Board to purchase the community shop is still awaited, this is not unexpected when dealing with a central government department. As soon as this is granted the project can move forward.

Twelve planning applications have been considered by the Council since the last newsletter.

Following a public consultation regarding the future grass cutting in the village a tender process is ongoing to select the grass cutting contractor for the next three seasons. The contractor will be agreed at the March meeting.

North Yorkshire County Council have replied regarding the locations for the relocation of the bus stop sign near the junction of Main Street and Gracious Street. They have a concern regarding the positioning near the junction, so an alternative location has been proposed at the other side of the junction. Their response is awaited.

Designs for a new information sign on Tally Hill to encourage responsible behaviour were produced by the children from Huby Primary School and details of the winning design are awaited from the school.

It has been agreed that a plaque will be erected to mark the history of the Huby Fox. Further details of this should be in an article in this newsletter.

The new Parish Council website has been drafted and it is hoped that this can be online shortly.

The North Yorkshire Police Traffic Bureau had responded regarding the speed tubes on Tollerton Road to assess whether a request for a 20mph zone outside the school would be made. Given the data gathered it was agreed not to pursue the request for a 20mph zone as there was no significant speeding.

Support for the Dementia Friendly Parish was discussed and hopefully an article explain further will be in this newsletter.

Hambleton District Council and North Yorkshire County Council disappear on 1 April to be replace by a new unitary authority called North Yorkshire Council. A charter is being agreed which will framework the future relationship with the Parish Council and councillors have been invited to an open day in Northallerton to learn more.

The next meeting of the Council will be held on Monday 6 March 2023 at 7.30pm in the village hall.

Exciting News!

We now have full planning permission to extend our community owned shop into the adjacent house to enable level access for customers, secure stock storage and a better environment for customers, staff and volunteers.

We are so fortunate to have some wonderful people in Huby & Sutton who have regularly volunteered their time and skills during the last 8 years to keep the shop and post office open as a 'not for profit' community owned asset. Without them we would not have a local shop or post office.

And as the local banks have just about all closed, maintaining the Post Office service is more vital than ever. The margin the shop makes each year enables the Post Office staff to open for you 43 hours a week - even though we are only remunerated for 20 hours as part of the national network.

Perhaps just as importantly, the shop has become a lovely hub for volunteers and customers.

The Parish Council will soon complete the purchase of the property and issue a new lease to us, and we are aiming for the building works to commence this summer - which we will have to fund. We are grateful to Hambleton District Council - which has awarded us a significant grant towards the works - but we still need to fund another £75k- £100k to make the alterations needed.

Several customers have already offered to donate towards the works. If you can help us by making a donation – large or small – please do so now so we can finalise our budgets, fit out plans and contractors. We'd prefer a cheque, but there is a separate collection box on the till for cash or cheques (payable to Barkers of Huby).

Our plans have been developed to enable the shop and post office to stay open for you for most of the works - which has inevitably made it a little more expensive to build.

Please help with a donation if you can. We want to ensure the village has a successful shop and post office – providing benefits for everyone - for as long as it is needed.

And last - but definitely not least - please do think about joining TeamBarkers as a volunteer.

The new, expanded shop is going to be wonderful with more than twice the space for the Post Office and retail areas, new shelving and fit out. We will need more volunteers to help serve customers, stock shelves and clean, and look after the garden. We can offer flexible or regular shifts from an hour or more to suit you. Without the 100 plus hours of volunteer time every week, we would not have a shop or post office.

Remember, this is YOUR shop so please don't just read this newsletter and then forget!

An Exciting Year Ahead at the Forest of Flowers in Huby

The Forest of Flowers conservation project on Tollerton Road, Huby had a fantastic 2022, with our 42,000 trees and 74 acres of wildflower meadows all thriving. A myriad of wildlife has found a home here, with many more moving in by the day. (Last year, we were officially Yorkshire's 2nd most populous butterfly

Our new small business had a good first year, raising funds to help manage the site more effectively for nature. In 2022, we collected and sold 84 kg of home-grown wildflower seeds, supporting others to create their own wildlife habitats.

We also held 8 public events including expert-led tours, from Dragonfly & Butterfly Spotting to a Wildflower Identification course and Bat Walk. This year we're holding even more events, all aiming to offer visitors a valuable experience, new skills and plenty of inspiration. Some highlights coming up this spring are:



Guided Tours - 25th March & 22nd April 10am

Tours will be led by Alwyn Craven, Founder and Kew-accredited Horticulturalist, providing background about the Forest of Flowers project and his motivations. He will discuss the flora now growing in the habitat, and answer questions about how to support wildlife in your green space, regardless of size.

Dawn Chorus Guided Walk - 13th May 4.30am

For just a few weeks each year, the UK's bird life performs a stunning symphony at sunrise. This guided walk offers a true wildlife soundscape as our resident birds wake up and sing to their hearts' content.

The Wonders of the Wild Places - Talk & Guided Walk - 20th May 1.30pm

Easingwold-based nature writer Rachel Lister Jones, author of The Wonders of the Wild Places, joins us to offer a talk about the UK's fascinating flora and fauna. She will then lead a walk through the habitat, helping us discover the spring wildflowers and wildlife. As a trained Mindfulness Coach, Rachel will lead some exercises to help us to absorb and appreciate our surroundings.

At this time of year, the club is winding down its talks programme and stepping up the visits, in search of yet more ideas to make our gardens more interesting or productive.

The first of the remaining two talks is from our old pal Doug Stewart with "Pruning made simple", on 22 March at Huby, just in time to stop us making a mess of the roses. He wants us to bring our secateurs, but I hope he's not going to tell me off for not cleaning mine properly. I know a good cutter clean stops transmission of maladies from one plant to another, but I'm far too idle to do it regularly.

The second talk is from a member of "'t Committee", Pamela Bankes, who will tell us about "The Amateur Beekeeper" on 26 April, when we'll also have the AGM. I think Pam is more of an expert than an amateur to judge by the honey her little friends produce. Incidentally, Pam is the only committee member from Huby and is feeling a bit lonely, hoping for a few more members from Huby to volunteer to join the committee. We have twice as many committee members from Crayke as from Huby! The AGM is a good time to volunteer but if you are shy, just contact any of the committee members named on your membership card to offer your services. It's not an onerous job I promise, and many hands make light work.

We'll certainly need help at the Plant Fair, for the first time ever at Huby. That will be on the Spring Bank Holiday Monday, 29 May, in the morning, so don't buy your bedding plants till then. Spare us some of the nice outside bits when you divide the overcrowded plants in your borders. You will know the names, but we might not, so don't forget the labels when you pot them up for us. We hope to provide coffee, tea, and cake for the visitors to the Huby Village Hall - helpers needed!

We have arranged an evening visit to the gardens at Sutton Park on 24 May, when they are at their best, with the Head Gardener to help answer your questions. We're also off for a day bus trip to the new RHS garden at Bridgewater near Manchester with a guided tour on Saturday 10 June. There might be room on the bus for non-members (£25) but only if we can't fill the bus with members (£20), and so it's essential to book with Hilary Kilner (0347810206 but preferably at a meeting). At Bridgewater there are three different places to eat, or you can take a picnic. Let the driver take the strain of the M62 and M56, poor longsuffering chap.

Hilary has organised another evening trip, near at hand again, to the Flowers of the Forest at Huby, following the recent very popular talk. This will be on Thursday 15 June and she will be taking bookings for this too, at our intervening meetings.

Peter William's talk on "Unnatural Gardening" last October raised lots of interest and the never resting Hilary is trying to organise a visit to his garden as well and hopefully we'll have the details by the March meeting. Oh, and naturally we are busy helping the local primary schools to contribute to the Village Show on Sunday, 2 July.... and thinking of the speakers for 23/24, starting in September. Huby Bowling Club – 2023

The Grounds Team have not stopped since the 2022 season ended, after spending a lot of time on the green, surrounds and paving they turned their attention to the Irrigation System.

Irrigation System

After the Club successfully achieved its fundraising target, the Irrigation System components were paid for and received, leaving our talented Grounds Team to set forth and install all the equipment. During February they plan to test the system, now that they have installed pipes, sprinklers, control panel, water tank and connected everything together.

This required a digger to locate the original and create the new channel, plus with hard manual labour from those present to backfill the hole as it moved forward. We are extremely grateful to Greg Milburn for the loan of the digger, John Bird for all his time spent making the connections live and Phil Mead who has been such a great supporter of the club in recent years, not least in generously funding this phase/project. All three have contributed towards our bowling club as we strive to improve facilities for its current and future members.

During the coming weeks the Grounds Team attention will return to preparing the playing surface ready for the new season. Any bare patches will be reseeded, and the green fed. Greg Milburn has kindly offered to cut the top of the hedge, where we couldn't reach with hand tools, for which we are extremely grateful. Stone will be ordered and laid to fill in the potholes in Robin Lane prior to the new season.

HUBY PLAYING FIELDS ASSOCIATION SPORTS FIELD AND PAVILION UPDATE

Progress is being made to get building control approval for our new design, and we expect this to be achieved in time for us to start building work in the next month or so.

We continue to work in the background to raise the funds required to complete the build – with nearly £250,000 raised we are about £80,000 short of our target so if there is anyone out there with access to grants or funds, PLEASE feel free to get in touch with us so we can explore all avenues. In the meantime though, we have sufficient to start construction and aim to get a secure, watertight building up by the end of the year, if not sooner.

This is how the pavilion will look from the front and back, with much more natural light inside due to the bi-fold doors that will overlook the playing fields.


Whilst we adapt to our new way of working, we would request that you allow us 5 working days to process and dispense your medication.

Soft plastics are the ones that when you scrunch them, they spring back, for example crisp and biscuit packets, peel back lids from plastic fruit containers, bread bags etc. We can't put these in our blue wheely bins, so they have had to go in the black bin or you have had to remember to take them to Easingwold to put in the little bins in either of the Co-ops. Co-op have provided us with yellow bags and as long as we take the full bags to Long Street Co-op, they are happy to take it on for recycling. It didn't take long to fill our first bag which was delivered to Annie, Co-op's Community Champion, on 15th October.

We hope to have a facility in the village shop to collect soft packaging once the new extension has been completed
