Parish Council News



Complaints have been received about speeding in the village especially on Main Street. The Council has requested that the speed camera van attend to help mitigate the problem. Please limit your speed to no more than 30mph within the village.

The permission from the Secretary of State for permission to borrow from the Public Works Loan Board to purchase the community shop has been granted and hopefully completion will now soon follow allowing the shop to get on with the building work to enhance the shop premises.

The plaque detailing the history of the Huby Fox has now been made and will be installed soon.

Hambleton District Council and North Yorkshire County Council disappeared on 1 April to be replaced by a new unitary authority called North Yorkshire Council. This will be responsible for all Council services not delivered by the Parish Council. Your North Yorkshire Councillor is Cllr Malcolm Taylor and he can be contacted at cllr.malcolm.taylor@northyorks.gov.uk

At this month's meeting Cllr John Corden was elected as Chairman and Cllr Jemma Dale as Vice-Chairman.

As we suffer the effects of Ash Die Back on some of the village trees the Council is keen to replace these trees with alternative species. Two recent trees will be replaced by Hornbeams.

The Council has commented on ten planning applications since the last newsletter. The volume of planning applications seem to be on the increase now the pandemic has subsided.

The next meeting of the Council will be held on Monday 3 July 2023 at 7.30pm in the village hall.

We would love to hear from anyone who would like to come to help at the meetings, DBS will be required in accordance with Girlguiding regulations

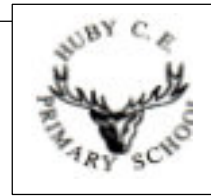

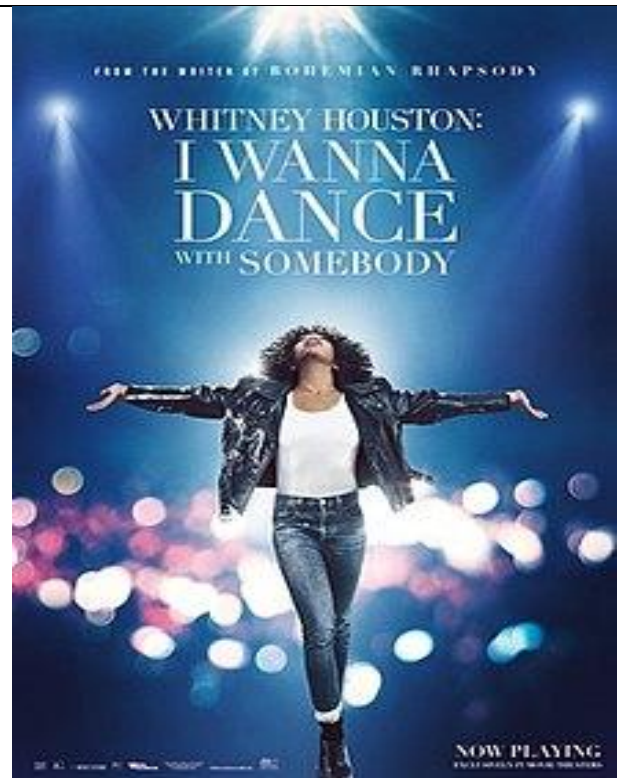

I wanna dance with somebody

British actor Naomi Ackie is very strong in the role of Houston (though with Whitney's original singing voice dubbed). Houston was, of course, the glorious pop star who achieved mainstream white-crossover success but was crushed by sellout accusations, overwork, drug addiction, family strife and her volatile relationship with her notorious husband, Bobby Brown, and was tragically denied feelings for her best friend and assistant Robyn Crawford. She was found dead in the bathtub of her LA hotel room in 2012 at just 48 with evidence of cocaine use.

Tuesday 11 July 20.00: What's love got to do with it?

Two childhood friends take opposing views on relationships in this peppy romcom directed by Shekhar Kapur and written by Jemima Khan. Documentary film-maker Zoe (Lily James) trawls dating apps and swipes her way to romance; doctor Kazim (Shazad Latif) takes the traditional route and opts for an arranged marriage. But when Zoe decides to document his journey, her camera reveals the stumbling blocks in each approach. The sparky chemistry between James and Latif leaves few surprises but it's an unexpectedly, disarmingly sweet film.

What's Love Got to Do With It? shines best as a crowd-pleasing comedy, and a sign that British romcoms aren't dead: they were only sleeping. (Independent)

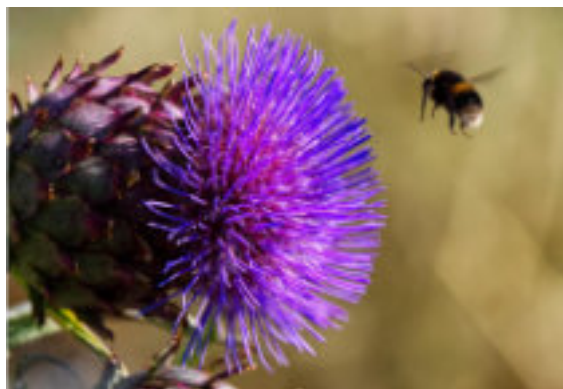

What's the link to Huby I hear you thinking...well there are many local activities that need volunteers including Barkers of Huby! Your local community shop relies on volunteers to serve customers, stock shelves, keep the shop clean and tidy and sort out deliveries. All straightforward tasks but all essential to keep the shop the vital local asset it is.

And volunteering is as much about benefiting the volunteer as it is the shop...it is a great way to meet people and feel useful. It doesn't take long to get trained up and there are always other volunteers happy to buddy up with you as you learn the ropes.

There are volunteering roles for everyone!

- If you spend your working time staring at a computer or working from home, a 2 hour slot in the shop will reconnect you back to people.
- If you need to boost your CV, showing you volunteer is a proven way to give you an edge over others.
- If you are newly retired or new to the village it's a great way to meet people and get involved in village life.
- And even if you can't commit to time in the shop, we always have little tasks that need doing, for example we have one volunteer who acts as our Health and Safety person and she checks everything is safe and in order.

We can offer flexible or regular shifts from an hour or more to suit you. Without the 100 plus hours of volunteer time every week, we would not have a shop or post office.

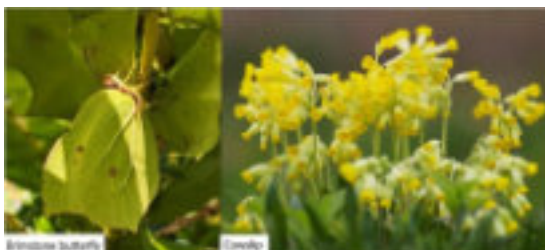


Right now is a great time to get involved as we are expecting that building works will start June. During the works we will keep the shop and post office open, but there may be times when there will be some disruption, noise and dust. Bear with us as the new, expanded shop is going to be wonderful with more than twice the space for the Post Office and retail areas, new shelving and fit out.

Finally, we celebrated our 8th birthday with a BBQ breakfast on 14 May where many volunteers joined us to celebrate 8 successful years (where has the time gone?) of running the shop as a community venture. In the 8 years we have gone from strength to strength, kept open all through lockdown and served the villages of Huby and Sutton.

An Exciting Summer Ahead at the Forest of Flowers in Huby

The Forest of Flowers conservation project on Tollerton Road, Huby has had a fantastic Spring. The wildflowers are already out in force across our 74 acres, with Cowslip (pictured) and Red campion doing incredibly well amongst many others. Our 42,000 trees are thriving and have leafed up well, ready for summer. We've had lots of bird life arrive too, not to mention 7 butterfly species already appearing.



We've provided lots of homegrown wildflower seeds across Huby and nationally to support customers in developing their own mini-meadows.

It's been a busy time with our public events too as we've held 9 so far, from bird tours to bat walks, with much more to come. Here's some of those coming up:

Wild Singing at Forest of Flowers – 4th June & 16th July, 2pm

Connect to nature with song as local singing leader and field-singer Jessa Liversidge leads a wild singing session at the Forest of Flowers. We'll immerse ourselves in the stunning habitat at its summer peak, and learn a selection of uplifting songs, all inspired in some way by nature. All abilities welcome!

Open Farm Sunday - 11th June 2pm A guided walk around the Forest of Flowers nature reserve, discussing the habitat and the new woodland/wildflower plantation in 2016/17.

An Introduction to Wildflowers and Identification - 25th June 1.30pm

Alwyn, a Kew-accredited Horticulturalist will lead this workshop taking a close look at our wildflower meadows while at their peak. Discussion will cover a wide range of native species, their benefits for wildlife and how to identify them.

Butterfly Spotting and Identification – 29th July 1.30pm

Over the last three years, Forest of Flowers has been the number 1 surveyed site in Yorkshire for butterfly population. During their peak season, local expert Nick Hall leads an afternoon looking at native UK butterflies and observing them in the Forest of Flowers habitat.

Dragonfly Spotting and Identification – 6th August, 1.30pm

We now have 18 large ponds on-site, home to a rapidly growing population of dragonfly and damselfly. Local expert Keith Gittens will help us to learn about and observe these wonderful species in action.

Wildflower Plants, Honey and Homegrown Fruit and Veg

At the start of June, we'll be selling a wide range of wildflower plugs and pot plants! We'll also have eggs from our chickens, and in later months our own honey plus homegrown vegetables. Our driveway stall will be signposted on Tollerton Road near Burn Hall, Huby.

Thank you to everyone in the local area who has been so supportive, including those buying seeds from our website, and the Huby WI who kindly invited us to speak at a recent meeting. We hope to meet many more local residents in the months ahead!

YAA airlifted Martyn to LGI when he suffered life-changing injuries after an accident at work. Determined to give thanks to the team who saved his life, Martyn organised his own triathlon challenge around his hometown of Dalton, with the help of his cousin, Stephen.

The triathlon took place on the 7th of May, had been adapted for Martyn, who completed a 100-metre walk in callipers, a 15-mile handcycle, and finished with a 500-metre swim. Stephen supported his cousin and completed a 6-mile run, 15-mile cycle and a 750-metre swim.

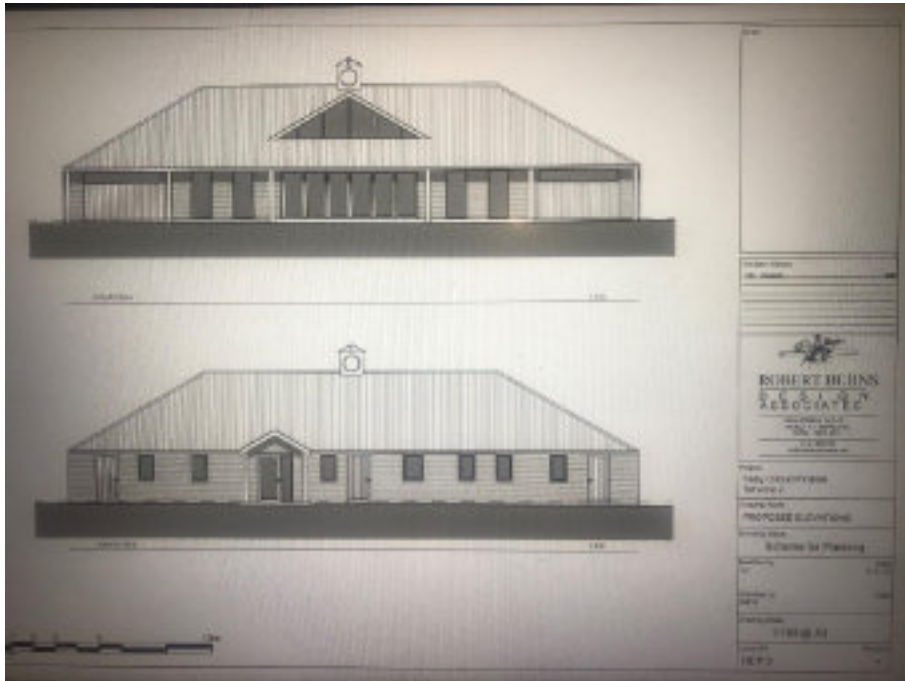

SPORTS FIELD AND PAVILION UPDATE

Following a recent committee meeting we are now in a position to start issuing Tender Packs to potential contractors to commence the works. This may take a few weeks to finalise but we are confident the groundworks, as stage 1 of the development, will be starting in the coming weeks. It is helpful we are coming into the drier season to assist in this part of the process, but once completed, the construction should happen quite soon after. Fundraising, as ever, remains our primary focus with several new applications for funding having been submitted in the last few weeks. We are also working on a couple of large applications that if successful, will go a long way towards us reaching our target. The build cost has increased by over £70,000 since we started this project only a handful of years ago which is driven largely by material costs. However, we haven't got far to go and will push on and will do our best to get it up and water tight very soon



Talking of money, we are now actively looking for a new Treasurer as our current one has to step down for the time being. So, if you have an interest and/or qualification in finance and would be happy to commit a few voluntary hours a month (tops!) then please get in touch. With the build programme nearing, it would be helpful to have someone on board quickly, with a variety of financial ins and outs, VAT etc to deal with imminently.

Please be aware that current repeat prescription turnaround time is 5 working days. This timescale is due to the fact we are currently dispensing around 6000-6500 items a month. This figure has gone up 1000 items in the last year. Please take this into consideration when ordering your repeats and give yourself additional time if required.
