Parish Council News

A new Parish Council website has been launched at www.hubyparishcouncil.uk containing all the agendas, minutes, policies, and financial documents of the Council.

The purchase of the community shop building by the Council had successfully taken place securing the future of the building in community hands. Work would now take place to extend and improve the shop facilities.

It was agreed that the paper weight of the Huby Voice by reduced from 120gsm to 80gsm and this will save the Council money each year whilst not affecting the content. It was decided to retain the colour for the time being.

Investigations into the moribund mobile phone mast project continued with all the original parties involved to ascertain if a way forward to deliver the mast is possible.

The installation of the Huby Fox plaque has taken place on Wednesday 19 July.

The next meeting of the Council will be held on Monday 4 September 2023 at 7.30pm in the village hall.

PAVILION PROJECT UPDATE

Work is still being carried out to source funding towards the building of the new sports pavilion, and I'm delighted to report that additional funding has been secured from the Whitwam Family Trust, so our very grateful thanks to them for their continued support for our project.

With construction costs continually rising we are also looking at a variety of alternative building methods to enable us to move forward sooner rather than later – more news on this in the next edition, all being well.



Tender packs have been issued to a number of local trades to allow us to start the building process, so we hope to be in a position very soon to start on the foundations, drainage etc.

Alongside all the work to replace the pavilion we are also looking at a football pitch improvement plan that could open up a valuable source of rental income in the coming seasons. In consultation with the North Riding FA, we understand there are a range of

tasks that will need to be carried out regularly to produce a good quality playing surface, so if there is anyone out there willing to volunteer their time for grounds maintenance including grass cutting, decompacting, re-seeding etc please feel free to get in touch.

We are planning to have some fundraising events to help with some of our dayto-day expenses until we can generate income from the new facility, so please look out for notices in the coming weeks and months.

We would also like to hear from anyone who'd like to help with funding via a crowdfunding initiative as a way of contributing anonymously if preferred.



Ryedale Festival comes to All Hallows'

The 28th July saw the first performance in All Hallows' as part of the programme of the Ryedale Festival 23. On a warm sunny morning over 100 festival goers arrived at the church to listen to a performance of the Troubadour Trail composed of saxophone and harp, not a normal combination you might think, but the sound the two players created was enchanting as the played pieces from Corelli to the modern day. They were met with warm applause which was thoroughly deserved. Prior to the concert which last just over an hour, coffee and tea were available outside the church in pleasant sunshine, much welcome in this season of un-summery weather.



The Festival organisers seemed very pleased with the venue so we hope we can have further visits from them in years to come. Do keep an eye open next summer as you might find we have a very enjoyable musical experience on our own doorstep. Book early however as the church was pretty full this year.

The Huby Fox

The Huby Fox used to be on the tall 66 foot maypole erected at the Tollerton road junction. It was dug up in the garden of Cariss House in the 1990's and was turned into a weather vane which can be seen on the barn.

The fox is a piece of Huby heritage and in order to preserve it for the village a plaque has been made. On Wednesday 19 July this was unveiled at Cariss House watched by a good crowd. Refreshments were served including a cake made by Sara Ellis decorated with a fox on a maypole.

The display of photographs showed amongst other things, the "Rearing of the Maypole" in 1907 – men digging the hole, the new pole being marched down Main Street accompanied by Easingwold Town band, the pole going up and the pole with the fox on the top. The pole had to be replaced every 10 or 12 years.

Huby WI has been enjoying 90th anniversary celebrations this summer. We had a lovely cake at the June meeting, and a display of our history over the last 90 years. Then there was a fantastic afternoon tea at Miss Daisy's in July.

Instead of our August meeting we are having a trip to Helmsley Walled Garden - fingers crossed for fine weather.

We are going back to our usual style of meeting on September 20th, when we will be having a talk entitled 'Cutting it fine'. We meet at Huby Methodist Church on the third Wednesday of each month at 7.45pm and new members will be made very welcome.





You will have seen lots of activity next to the shop in recent weeks as our shop extension and improvement plans come to life. Copies of internal and external plans are in the shop if anyone hasn't seen them yet. The diagram shows how the finished shop will look but come along and take a peek through the fencing and see the foundations to get a real sense of the scale of the new shop.





Our builders have moved on from clearing the site to knocking down the front house extension, taking up internal floors, laying foundations and starting brickwork.

We aim to start first fix electrics and plumbing by mid-September and may need to close the shop for a few days at some point when we are ready to knock through. We are aiming to have all the works completed and the shop and post

office open by November. We are very keen for the new shop and post office to be up and running in the lead up to Christmas. We held two drop-in sessions for our volunteers in July, just before the builders started works, to explain the plans and discuss how the new space would work for customers and volunteers.

In the meantime, the existing shop remains as busy as ever, and we welcomed three new volunteers this month. If you've ever thought about volunteering, now is a great time to give it a go. Volunteers serve customers, stock shelves, keep the shop clean and tidy and sort out deliveries. Each shift is usually 2 hours, and you don't have to commit to the same two hours each week.

Many of our volunteers say they enjoy volunteering at the shop because they get something from it. It is a great way to meet people and feel useful. It doesn't take long to get trained up and there are always other volunteers happy to buddy up with you as you learn the ropes.



Summer at the Forest of Flowers in Huby

It's been an exciting summer at the Forest of Flowers in Huby - a season of many firsts for our project! In June, we had 180 visitors - the most in a single month yet, with lots joining our events, plus local group visits such as Huby and Sutton

Gardening Club and the U3A Wildflower Group. It's been fantastic to share our 74 acres of new wildflower meadows and woodland with so many nature-enthusiasts.

This summer has been a spectacular time to see the meadows, with Oxeye daisies and Vipers bugloss among the many wildflowers thriving (pictured left).

Our butterflies have been taking full advantage of the wildflowers - we had a record week, with a whopping 680 spotted in a single survey! Over the last

3 years we've had the most butterfly sightings of any area in Yorkshire, and 2023 is shaping up to be another fantastic year. We've also spotted the White-letter hairstreak and Wall butterflies, both priority species struggling in the UK at the moment.

Another first for us was holding a stall at the Huby and Sutton Show! It was lovely to meet so many locals, with many wanting to support nature in some way. We had the added bonus of winning some photography prizes, including 2nd place in the wildlife category for this stunning Elephant Hawk-moth (pictured below).

This year, as well as collecting wildflower seeds from our meadows, we've grown more pot plants than ever before to raise money for our conservation work, while helping others create their own wildflower habitat.

We provided 300 Tansy plants to the Tansy Beetle Action Group, which will be used to develop habitat for this beautiful green beetle, endangered and living almost solely on the banks of the River Ouse in York.

From our driveway stall, we sell pot plants of around 30 wildflower species, from Cowslip to Teasel, Purple Loosestrife to Yarrow. We also have honey for sale, from our own bees foraging across the wildflower meadows. You can visit our driveway stall, open all day every day, signposted near Burn Hall Hotel.

For anyone who'd like to see the Forest of Flowers, we have a range of events coming up, including:

Twilight Nature Walk – Bats, Moths and More – Saturday 9th September, 7 - 9.30pm

Join us at twilight for an exciting evening of nature watching! Our guided walk will showcase our thriving population of bats, led by local expert Paul Bamber. We'll also set up moth traps and look at any finds together! We'll also see and hear plenty of bird life at dusk, such as owls, plus lots of other nocturnal wildlife.
