Parish Council News

The Council has met once since the last Huby Voice, on 8 January 2025.

Seventeen planning application have been considered.

Councillors attended the public consultation in the village hall put on by the company which has submitted a solar farm application between Huby and Sutton.

North Yorkshire Council are producing their local plan, and it was noted that 130 sites have been brought forward across the County for consideration.

North Yorkshire Councillor Malcolm Taylor reported on the North Yorkshire Council's budget and the five car support hubs that are to be built.

North Yorkshire Council had surveyed 42 villages for mobile phone coverage and Huby was the 5th worst. Work continues to get suitable coverage in the parish.

A larger dog waste bin has been requested from North Yorkshire Council at Tally Hill due to the existing one filling up too quickly. The dog warden has also been requested to put up additional anti fouling signage around the village.

The next meeting is scheduled to be held on Wednesday 12 March 2025 at 7pm.

**It is an offence under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) act
1996 not to clear up after your dog. The act states
that being unaware or not having a bag are not
excuses to not pick up.**

**Being found guilty of dog fouling may result in a fine of
up to £1000.**

**There are plenty of dog waste bins in the Village.
You can put securely bagged dog waste in your
normal black bin, but not the recycling or garden
waste bin.**

**Please do not allow your pet to foul on agricultural
land, this will potentially end up in the food chain
then YOU may eat it!**

After our talk by the enthusiastic head gardener turned nursery owner Ben Preston on 26 February at Sutton Village Hall, we have Chris Pearson who will tell us about “Gardening with wildlife at Shandy Hall” in the Huby Memorial Village Hall on 26 March. After that, on 23 April, Steve Bradley on “Making the most of growing plants in pots” at Sutton, all at 7.45. I’m sure pub quizzers will know that 23 April is Shakespeare’s birthday (1564) as well as St. George’s day! Visitors are asked to pay £2 per talk but free, of course, to members (£10 per year, due next September). Garden waste licences now available

Residents can now pay for their licence for the 2025 garden waste season.

A licence costs £49 for collections between March and early December.

This provides a cost-effective way for residents to dispose of garden waste.

The licence covers one 240-litre wheelie bin to be emptied fortnightly.

Anyone who wishes to have more than one bin emptied will need to pay for a licence for each additional bin. Residents can also pay for a licence at any time throughout the season but are encouraged to do so before the start of the service in March as the cost will remain the same.

Once paid, a licence pack should arrive within 14 days.

Winter at the Forest of Flowers



The last few months have seen some spectacular sights at the Forest of Flowers in Huby. Very low temperatures turned the habitat into a crisp winter wonderland, with some amazing natural beauty making the conditions all the more bearable to work in! A very cold week saw stunning ice formations on our ponds (pictured).

The wildlife has been out in force even in winter, with plenty of bird life foraging across the habitat here. Taking part in the RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch, we saw 15 species and 49 individuals within an hour. Blue tits were most common (x13) with Chaffinches a close second (x10), and some lovely sightings of Goldcrest (x1), Bullfinch (x4) and Redpoll (x1). We also had a Sparrowhawk try its best to disrupt our survey!



Volunteering

Our team of volunteers have accomplished an incredible amount this season - stoic in the adverse weather. No week has been the same, with tasks including willow coppicing, tree guard collection and setting up a new area for our 3 pigs to roam.

Grow Your Own Wildflowers

If you'd like to grow some stunning wildflowers to help our native wildlife, the recommended sowing season is just around the corner (March – May). We offer locally-grown seeds, hand-collected from our 100-acres of meadows in Huby. Our online Seed Shop has various seed mixes, plus 50+ individual wildflower species, and we will have potted plants available from April/May. 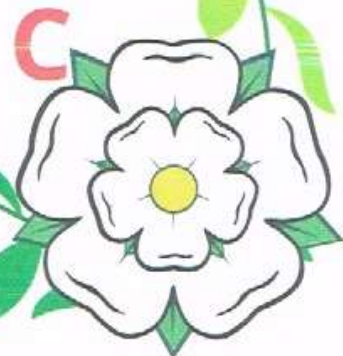
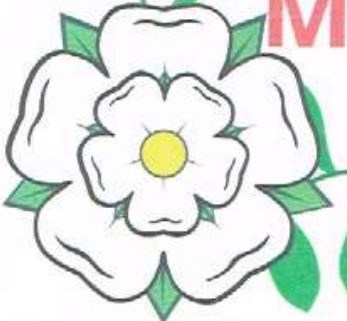

Stillington Surgery Patient Participation Group (PPG)

Urgent Care Team

If you have difficulty getting what you believe to be an urgent appointment at our own Surgery in Stillington, there is potentially another option.

Where patients cannot get the appointment required, they may be referred by our receptionists to the Urgent Care Team recently located in Easingwold. This may initially be a telephone consultation.

The Urgent Care Team can deal with Urine, Chest or Ear infections, Tonsillitis, Diarrhoea, Vomiting, Stomach ache, Headache, Rashes, Insect bites, Infected wounds, Minor injuries and Sprains and strains.

The Urgent Care team DO NOT cover Life threatening emergencies (call 999) or any Chronic or ongoing issues being managed by your own GP. In this instance, a routine appointment with your GP would be more appropriate.

Surgery Notice Boards

When you are next in the Surgery, please scan the updated and refreshed Notice Boards for information that may help you be more aware of information and/or support available for various conditions.

The current focus subjects are various types of Arthritis and Joint Replacement.

Lots of other information is available. Feel free to pick of any of the leaflets available

Music in the Surgery

If you have visited the Surgery recently you will have noticed that music is now being played in the Waiting Room. Hopefully this is not too intrusive.

Due to our space limitations, music is being used to provide a degree of confidentiality to patients at reception or on the phone to our receptionists.

To aid confidentiality further, it would be appreciated if patients queueing at reception could stand back to allow other patients a degree of privacy.

If as a patient you feel a need for greater privacy than afforded at reception, please ask to be seen in a private room.

Use of NHS APP

If you are comfortable using Mobile phone, Ipad, Laptop or Computer Apps we would actively encourage you to maximise the use of the NHS App.

You can use the NHS App to view and manage prescriptions, order repeat prescriptions, check availability of appointments and book a time/date, see results and history from ether GP or hospital tests, see history of letters on file and much, much more.

Your increased use of NHS App reduces the workload and time pressures on our Surgery Staff, saves you time and puts more information at your fingertips.

One of our PPG members, Chris, is available to help you start or enhance the use of your NHS APP on a one-to-one basis.

All “training” sessions are from 14.00 to 16.00 hours and dates are: -

Friday 28th March, Friday 2nd May, Friday 6th June.

Please let the Surgery know if you wish to attend a particular training session to assist our resource planning. When attending, please bring along your own device to be used for NHS APP access.

Further dates and/or times can be provided if necessary.

Patients who cannot or do not wish to use the NHS App can still make prescription requests and GP/Nurse appointments in the current way.

HUBY VILLAGE WALKS

Now that the whole network of Village Walks is on public rights of way, and walking weather will soon be with us, All walks leaflets are available in the Village Shop, so go for it!

Some of these rights of way cross private land, and to protect the landowners' property we would remind you of the responsibilities of walkers in the *COUNTRYSIDE CODE*.

LITTER Take litter home - leave no trace of your visit.

DOGS Always keep dogs under control and in sight. Dog poo – bag it and bin it!

Livestock and animals. Do not feed livestock, horses or wild animals as it can cause them harm. Horse Riders Follow waymarkers and local signs. Other path users should give way to horse riders

Cyclists Follow waymarkers and local signs. Give way to pedestrians and horse riders.

Care for Nature Do not cause damage or disturbance and leave no trace of your visit.

In return the North Yorkshire Leaflet *DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF LANDOWNERS AND FARMERS* sets out what walkers can expect when walking over their land. In particular:

Dangerous livestock No animals known to be aggressive (including any bull of whatever breed) to be in a field to which the public has any access.

VEGETATION Vegetation cut back from the sides and from above so that it does not inconvenience the public or prevent the line of the right of way being apparent on the ground:

OBSTRUCTIONS Keep rights of way clear of any obstructions such as padlocked gates, rubbish, barbed wire, slurry, manure, electric fences, hedgerows and chained or loose dogs, and warn users of potential dangers.

Stiles and gates All stiles and gates to be maintained in a safe condition.

Cross-field footpaths Cross-field footpaths must not be left ploughed up or disturbed for more than 14 days. After this time any disturbance must be re-instated.

Problems

If walkers experience any problems along the way, eg a locked gate, they can report it direct to paths@northyorks.gov.uk giving details of the problem, its location, and a photo if possible.
