Parish Council News

The Council has met twice since the last Huby Voice, on 12 March and 14 May 2025.

Fourteen planning applications have been considered.

A larger dog waste bin has been installed at Tally Hill and additional signage ordered to be put on the streetlights.

Signage highlighting the dangers of dog fouling on Tally Hill would hopefully be produced in conjunction with the children at the Primary School. It was decided that at the moment the need to enact a dogs on lead byelaw was not necessary but could be considered again if the problem persists.

North Yorkshire Councillor Malcolm Taylor reported on his grants to Huby Corinthians and the PTA as well as the Local Government Boundary Review which could move Huby into the Easingwold Division for the 2027 elections and also the possible Local Government settlement from Central Government.

Having received and considered photographic evidence received from residents it was agreed that the Parish Council should request that North Yorkshire Council introduce yellow lining at the junction of Robin Lane and Main Street due to dangerous parking making children and others vulnerable.

A new volunteer editor was still sought for the Huby Voice. If no one comes forward to take over this very important role to the village then the newsletter will have to cease. Please would anyone interested contact the Clerk.

HUBY PLAYING FIELDS ASSOCIATION PAVILION PROJECT UPDATE – MAY 2025





Progress has been very encouraging since January and the remaining works of cladding the exterior and building a porch outside the main entrance will be done and Phase 1 – a secure, watertight building – will be completed by the end of May.

Nik and Josh Sadler of Sadler and Rose Builders have done a remarkable job and there has been much positive feedback of how the pavilion looks. As a group we're delighted and look forward to the start of Phase 2.

Work has already started to source materials and engage with trades to get the electrics, plumbing and sewage dealt with as soon as funding allows. As ever this final part remains the most challenging, as over the last few years the availability of grants for projects like ours have become very scarce, so we are leaving no stone unturned in our search for the required funds to get the project finished and allow usage of the pavilion to start as soon as possible.

On that basis if you know anyone with contacts in the supply chain who may be in a position to help us out, please feel free to contact anyone on the Playing Fields Committee to enable us to pursue it.

Similarly, if you are happy to support the project through a donation then we have a range of options available, with GoFundMe and Just Giving sites already set up, and Easy Fundraising activated as well. Alternatively, a deposit directly into our account can also be done if you prefer – as some members of the village have already done, thank you - so please contact us via email and we can share our account details with you.

We are in the process of devising ways of recognising donators – either individual or corporate – so watch this space for further news in the next edition.

Following the closure of the area Neighbourhood Watch scheme in Easingwold, and also the sad passing of our Treasurer Roger Kraemer, we have taken the decision to close the Neighbourhood Watch in Huby and Sutton-on-the-Forest, with immediate effect.

Thankfully we live in a relatively low crime area, and the lack of activity in recent years has effectively made our scheme redundant anyway, but it was felt that alternative media, particularly Facebook, was a more efficient way of alerting the community of any activity deemed serious enough to share, and it didn't need a designated body to circulate that information other than the administrators of the village Facebook pages.

Equally, the Facebook page has more followers than we had email addresses, so it seemed a logical evolutionary step to make.

So, thank you to all those volunteers from down the years who have contributed in some way. All funds that had been accumulated in recent years have also been distributed locally to the Huby Village Hall and the Huby Sports Pavilion project, and a final run of wheelie-bin stickers have been printed – available free of charge in the Village Shop for anyone who wants or needs them.


Huby Women's Institute is a group of 30 friendly women who meet together every month to learn something new and meet friends old and new.

Spring at the Forest of Flowers, Huby

This spring has brought us some glorious weather, with our wildflower meadows and new woodland constantly bathed in sunshine. This has meant fantastic conditions for pollinators, with our tree blossom, willow and wildflowers out in force, providing an amazing source of nectar and pollen.

On the down side, the dry weather has meant that our 18 ponds are dwindling with some already dry. This could impact our wildlife which relies on a good water level, not least our amphibians, dragonflies and mayflies. Let's hope some rain will be on its way soon.

Butterflies have been one of the main winners from the warm weather lately. Our weekly surveys began in April, and we've seen a significant rise in numbers on last year. (One week in May had more than 3 times the sightings we had in the same week in 2024.) We've also seen more Small Tortoiseshells so far this year than in the whole of 2024!



The icing on the cake has been a brand new butterfly species to the site: Dingy skipper! This gives us 25 species and counting. This one breeds on Bird's-foot Trefoil, which is abundant in our meadows (the same reason we saw the return of the Common Blue, which also relies on this wildflower). The Dingy skipper is scarce in the UK and particularly in Yorkshire, so it's fantastic to see it and we hope it makes a permanent home here.

We've had more new arrivals recently, with the birth of our first goat kid for 3 years. Meet Henrietta! She is half Golden Guernsey (now Royal Golden Guernsey), a rare breed which we love. Our small herd of 6 goats give us lovely milk and cheese (plus a bit of mischief now and then!). Our Open Farm Sunday event and general Guided Tours include a visit to see the goats and pigs for anyone who'd like to meet them.



Also in our smallholding are 10 bee hives, which are producing honey at a fantastic rate due to the sunshine and abundance of wildflowers to forage on! We have recently finished our first harvest of the year and have lots of delicious spring honey now in stock. If you'd like some, it's now available at Huby and Sutton Community Shop, and at our events. All funds raised support our project for nature conservation across our 100-acre habitat in Huby.

PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOG!

THIS INCLUDES THE EDGE OF THE FIELDS

THE INSTANCES OF DOG FOULING IN THE VILLAGE, ON THE SPORTS FIELD AND ON TALLY HILL ARE INCREASING.

DOG WASTE CAN CARRY DISEASES WHICH MAY CAUSE BLINDNESS.

It is an offence under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) act 1996 not to clear up after your dog. The act states that being unaware or not having a bag are not excuses to not pick up.

Being found guilty of dog fouling may result in a fine of up to £1000.

There are plenty of dog waste bins in the Village. You can put securely bagged dog waste in your normal black bin, but not the recycling or garden waste bin.

Please do not allow your pet to foul on agricultural land, this will potentially end up in the food chain then YOU may eat it!



In the early 1960s, 19-year-old Bob Dylan arrives in New York with his guitar and revolutionary talent, destined to change the course of American music. Forming his most intimate relationships during his rise to fame, he grows restless with the folk movement, making a controversial choice that reverberates worldwide.

It's a remarkable performance. Star of the moment Timothée Chalamet inhabits the loose-limbed, live-wire physicality of the young Bob Dylan and makes an impressively good fist of capturing the frayed hessian of his distinctive voice.

Hit after hummable hit, the soundtrack is a tribute to Dylan's incredible creativity during this period of his career, and the impact the songs had on his audiences. Guardian


