I am also excited to be organising Huby Village Christmas Fair, you may have noticed details on the front page

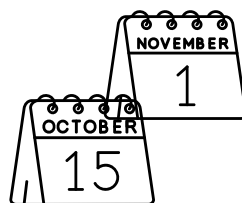

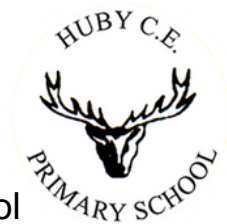

# Huby Primary School

## *Summer Term*



The last half term of the school year has proven, as ever, to be a busy one for Huby Primary School. As we start to get ready to return to school after a lovely 6-week break, we'd love to reflect back and share some of our highlights from the last few weeks of term



All of our children from reception to year six enjoyed making full use of our heated swimming pool, with each class have 3 swimming lessons a week. Our nursery children also had the opportunity to have a swim, and we were thrilled to have a number of open sessions for nursery aged children from around the community to dip their toes in too.

These sessions were open to any 3-4 year olds, not just our own children, and were facilitated by our qualified swimming teacher. We had a great response, and it was wonderful to see the younger children having so much fun. We can't wait for them to enjoy regular swimming when they join reception class.

In key stage two, the last few weeks of term was buzzing with scripts, song practice and stage design as they prepared for their end of year performance, held at the Galtres Centre over two packed out evenings. After 5 long years, Phase 1 – a secure, watertight building – is now complete and we couldn't be more pleased with how the pavilion now looks. Nik and Josh (Sadler and Rose) who have skilfully transformed our vision into a reality have done a fabulous job – great work.

Phase 2 fundraising is well underway and we recently submitted a substantial request that we're anxiously awaiting the outcome of!

As ever this process remains the most challenging, since the availability of grants for projects like ours have become very scarce in recent years, and consequently we are leaving no stone unturned in our search for the required funds to get the project finished and allow usage of the pavilion to start as soon as possible.

On that basis if you know anyone with contacts in the supply chain who may be in a position to help us out, please feel free to contact anyone on the Playing Fields Committee to enable us to pursue it.

Similarly, if you are happy to support the project through a donation then we have a range of options available, with GoFundMe and Just Giving sites already set up, and Easy Fundraising activated as well. # **Sutton and Huby Gardening Club**

The Gardening Club is starting the 25/26 programme on 24 September at the Huby Memorial Village Hall. The meeting will start at 7.45 but as we will be collecting the year subs then it would be good to arrive a bit earlier. The sub remains at the very reasonable £10 for eight monthly talks alternating between Huby and Sutton and several outings (maybe with a small extra charge). There are concessions for the over 80's and students go free. One of the outings will be to a distant garden with a "free to members bus". Jill Ward is the speaker on September 24 th and she will tell us about the gardens at Burnby Hall. They are much, much bigger and a lot more interesting than when I first came to Sutton! Speakers are always experts on their topic and frequently bring plants for sale they have raised themselves, all at a reasonable price and advice on how to grow them well.

One of the year's talks is on "Gardening Disasters". We've all had our those. This year I bought, as I thought, my usual scarlet pelargoniums (some people call them geraniums) as large plug plants, for a nice urn I've got at the far end of the garden, only to find they are a variety that only grows a few inches high. I've learned! The midget geraniums are now lurking elsewhere, only visible on close inspections of the garden instead of commanding attention. You won't be the only one not to know the answers!

# Summer at the Forest of Flowers, Huby

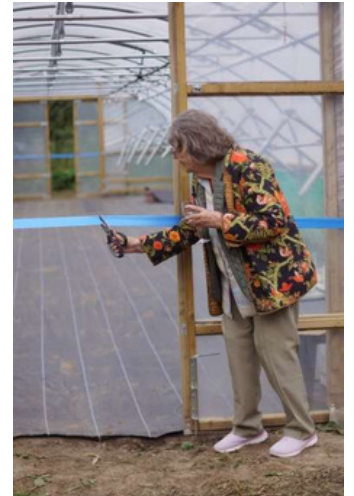


This summer has been incredible for the flora and fauna at our 100-acre meadows and woodland. The glorious weather has given us an amazing display of wildflowers, making the habitat more colourful and nectar-rich than ever. Our diverse range of species means a long-flowering season too, set to continue until October, so lots more still to come!

## *Polytunnel Party*

We've officially opened our brand new polytunnel, with the launch taking place at our Volunteer Summer Party!

This commercial-sized tunnel has been months in the making, so we're excited to finally move in. It's now housing thousands of wildflower plugs and potted plants which are destined for good homes in the area, raising vital funds for our work along the way. Huge thanks to our very special volunteers who made it happen, and to Rosalind (Alwyn's Mum) for cutting the ribbon!



## *High Flyers*

Our butterfly data shows we're on track for a record-breaking year at the Forest of Flowers!

All the dry, sunny weather has created the perfect flying conditions and lots of wildflowers for butterflies to forage on. We've already seen more Large Whites, Common Blues, and Purple Hairstreaks than any other year.

We've also had some exciting finds, with 3 new species recorded on-site: Essex Skipper, Dingy Skipper and Clouded Yellow (pictured, credit: Jess Chappell).

## *Wildflower Seed Harvest*

Our seed harvest is in full swing and we've been busy in the meadows hand-collecting from lots of species, including Yellow Rattle, Bird's-Foot Trefoil and Cowslip. The next sowing season (Sept - Oct) brings an opportunity for everyone to support biodiversity in the area by growing wildflowers.

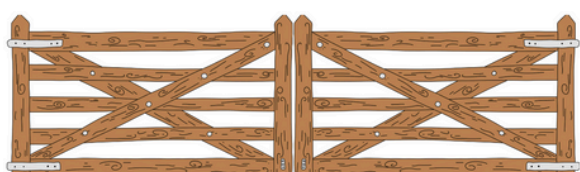

# **Stillington Surgery**

## *Online Consultations and Admin Requests*

In addition to traditional consulting methods, we now offer the option to consult online with the Surgery. This online option provides greater flexibility as your request form can be completed at any time of day avoiding the need to wait for opening hours and time spent queuing on the telephone.

The online consultation option can be accessed from the home page of our website and is particularly useful for requesting sick notes, ordering acute medication, reporting medication concerns and administrative queries.

Online consultations will not replace traditional consulting methods but are an additional method of supporting both the ever-increasing demands on our Surgery and the busy lives of our patients.

## *Flu vaccination campaign 2025*

We will again be offering flu vaccinations to all our patients aged 65+, those in 'at risk' groups as defined by NHS England, pregnant ladies and carers. These vaccinations have already been purchased by the Surgery ready for the start of the flu campaign which this year is 1<sup>st</sup> October 2025.

The funding which we receive from our flu campaign supports the Services which we provide throughout the year. We will be sending out links for online booking or appointments can be made by contacting the Surgery on 01347 810332.

## *Please keep your appointment*

Recently we have not been able to offer patients an appointment with our Nursing team as quickly as we usually would. This has been due to several factors but one of the most significant is the number of missed appointments and late cancellations within our Nursing Team. During June and July we encountered a total of 13.5 hours of missed Nursing appointments due to patients simply failing to attend and over 4 hours of appointments cancelled at such short notice that we were unable to re-book the slot. This has resulted in some patients having either had to wait longer or travel further afield for blood tests.

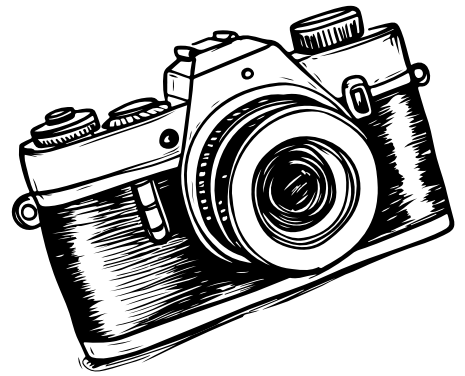

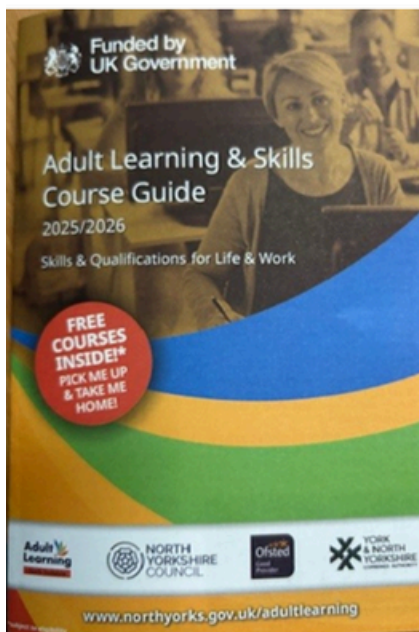
