Huby and Sutton Community Shop




The Huby and Sutton Community Shop is a vital part of village life, run by volunteers and owned by local shareholders. It operates as a not-for-profit community enterprise, with all surplus reinvested into improving the shop and supporting the community.

Open seven days a week, with the Post Office operating six days, the shop supports local suppliers by stocking a range of fresh and local produce as well as everyday essentials.

Summer has flown by here in Huby, and we've been thrilled to welcome back all of our children, and some new faces too, to the 2025/2026 academic year. It may have only just begun, but we've already had a flying start to the year, and it doesn't look like things will be slowing down any time soon!








Over the summer, Easingwold Library held its annual summer reading challenge, and we were delighted to present 34 of our children with certificates for completing the challenge. We were thrilled to be told that our school had the highest percentage of children engaging with the challenge of all local schools in the area. We can't wait for some of our classes to visit the library again soon.

Our new school council representatives, house captains and vice captains have been chosen for the year. The school council has representatives voted by the children from each year group, all of whom were asked to prepare something to share with their class explaining why they would make a good representative. This is a wonderful opportunity for the children to develop confidence, responsibility and leadership skills.

We have been very lucky to have introduced two new weekly awards this year, one for reading, and one for multi-sports, both of which were very kindly donated by last year's year six families. Each week, one student will be selected for each of the awards, given to them in our Friday celebration worship.

We've had a number of school trips already this term, including our Reception, Year One and Year Two children, who headed over to Husthwaite School for an afternoon with six other primary schools, taking part in the Easingwold Cluster FunRun. The sun shone, and all of the children tried their very best and showed a huge amount of determination, teamwork and enthusiasm, representing Huby School and our values wonderfully.



Our Year Three and Year Four children have enjoyed, at Murton Park, learning about the Stone Age, and our Year Five and Year Six children had a super day at Ripon Cathedral, taking in a combination of history, appreciation of architecture, symbolism and meaning, interpreted through Harold Gosney's Sculptures, and clay modelling and stained glass window making.

We're very lucky at Huby School to have such a variety of school trips for our children, which wouldn't be possible without support from parents, volunteers and governors, but we're even more lucky to have children who are super ambassadors for Huby School, and represent us so well while visiting all of these wonderful places.

As well as school trips, we also have a number of visitors into school throughout each half term who add a huge amount of value to our children's learning. We have Alfie the Dog (our PAT dog), and other volunteers, who come regularly to hear the children read; we have

Mr Davis come and run PE sessions with all of our classes every week; Mr Wilton who comes to teach our children various brass instruments; representatives from York City who come and run football sessions after school each week; and



Open The Book, who come and hold interactive assemblies with our children – this half term we learnt from them that it's never too late to make things right.



Our Year Six children have undertaken their Bikeability training this half term. In Level 1 they worked to develop cycle handing skills in the playground, before venturing out onto the roads of Huby in the afternoon with their instructors, putting all that they had learned into practice.

We were thrilled to be able to hold our annual Harvest Festival at All Hallows Church, in Sutton, again this year. All of our children play a very important part in each of our church services, and lots of time, preparation and practice goes in to sharing what we've learned with our families, who come to watch. This year all of the food we collected was donated to Easingwold Food Bank.

The PTA have held their always popular film night this half term, with hot dogs and sweet treats for all of the children. It's a great opportunity for them to relax and enjoy a film with their friends.



Although the new year has only just begun, we're already preparing for next year with an open evening for new Reception starters in September 2026. We had a lovely afternoon sharing our school and facilities with new families, who are currently investigating different settings for their children to start at next year.




Sutton and Huby Gardening Club

Summer at the Forest of Flowers, Huby



It's been a productive and momentous autumn here at our nature reserve on the outskirts of Huby. Our harvesting efforts are coming to a close, with our most diverse wildflower seed mix ever, a bumper honey harvest, and more apples than we know what to do with! All this while surrounded by some spectacular autumn colour in our woodland and our ponds looking much healthier after some much-needed rainfall.

Wildflowers for York's Green Corridors

We recently delivered over 3,000 wildflowers to the fantastic charity St Nicks in York. Our volunteers have worked hard all year to get these plants ready. It's wonderful to see them going to a great home. They will be planted out across Yorks green corridors, providing a vital biodiversity boost. 2,200 Tansy are included, providing much-needed habitat for the endangered Tansy Beetle, among lots more wildlife.



Sweet Spot



It's been a spectacular year for our bees, with lots of sunshine meaning a vast amount of flowers and nectar in our meadows. This autumn, we finished a bumper harvest and overall our 8 hives have produced around 1,000 jars of honey - a record year and double our usual crop! Our wide range of wildflowers, shrubs and trees in full bloom this year has made for a delicious, well-rounded honey, which is already going down well with customers. We sell it locally, including at the **Huby and Sutton**Community Shop. All proceeds go to our conservation project, so a huge THANK YOU to everyone who supports us by purchasing our honey and wildflower seeds. Hopefully these will make great gifts for the upcoming festive season too!

Tube by Tube

Last winter we removed around 8,000 plastic tree tubes from the woodland, after they served their purpose in protecting our young saplings. Lately we took all these to be recycled - the final stage of the process.

We couldn't be prouder of our volunteer team who contributed so much to the collection effort. We now have an empty shed ready to be filled with more tubes from our 74-acre woodland this winter.

If you would like to be part of our volunteer team, our friendly and welcoming group meets every Monday 9.30 - 12, often with a choice of tasks, followed by well-deserved coffee and cake.




With the music of Simon & Garfunkel and a superb performance by Anne Bancroft as Mrs Robinson. It won Mike Nichols a deserved best director Oscar.
