There are currently two vacancies on the Parish Council. If you feel you would like to be co-opted onto the Council or would just like more information on the role then please do email the Clerk.

The Council met on Wednesday 9 September 2025 and on Wednesday 12 November 2025. Seven planning applications were considered across both meetings.

Applications for section 106 grants from North Yorkshire Council by Huby Bowls Club and Huby Playing Fields Association were supported.

It was agreed to repair the Tally Hill bench at a cost of no more than £150.

A meeting was requested with North Yorkshire Council to discuss a proposal by a resident to have NYC install a mini roundabout at the Main Street / Tollerton Road junction.

The Local Government Boundary Commission had released their final recommendations for new North Yorkshire Council divisional boundaries. These would now be put before Parliament and would come into effect for the May 2027 election.

The next meeting is scheduled to be held on Wednesday 11 March 2026 at 7pm in the Village Hall.

The King's Award - join the Celebration!

There's a real sense of pride at Huby & Sutton Community Shop, after it was awarded The King's Award for Voluntary Service (KAVS), the highest honour a UK voluntary group can receive and the equivalent of an MBE.

This prestigious recognition celebrates the incredible dedication of the shop's volunteers and the vital role the shop plays in our community.



Owned by the community and run entirely by volunteers, the shop is much more than a place to pick up groceries. It provides a valued local service, offering newspapers, local produce, and Post Office services six days a week. It is also a hub of opportunity, supporting local suppliers and providing work experience for young people. Shoppers can enjoy a wide range of goods including bread, milk, honey, coffee, spirits and flowers.

Volunteer Coordinator Marina Hilditch shared her joy:

"Our volunteers are absolutely delighted that our community shop has been recognised with The King's Award for Voluntary Service. This honour reflects the incredible commitment of our volunteers who give their time and energy to keep the shop running and to serve our villages with warmth and care. It's a celebration of what can be achieved when a community comes together."

Representatives from the shop will receive the award crystal and certificate from the Lord-Lieutenant of North Yorkshire, and two volunteers will also attend a Royal Garden Party at Buckingham Palace next spring.

To mark this fantastic achievement, a community celebration event is being planned in the coming months. More details will be shared shortly and we hope many of you will join us to celebrate together.

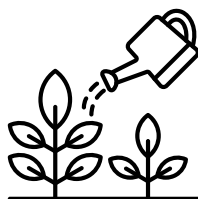

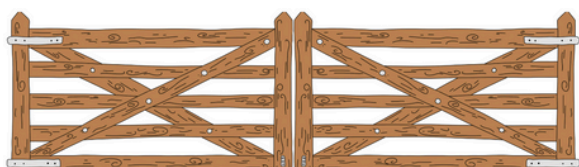

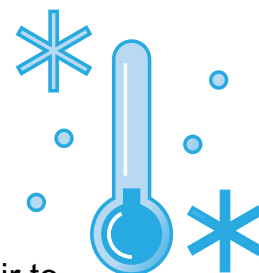
Surviving Winter Fund

Huby Walks Group

How it all began - 9 people originally got together to create the 11 Huby Walks leaflets. We all knew the lanes well but thought that others might like a map and clear instructions describing our rights-of-way. We spent 4-5 years between 2014-19 doing the work before being ready to print. Over this time we walked each of the rights of way in both directions, checking on clarity of instructions and whether waymarkers were needed. We liaised with the Footpaths Officers at NYC on these, they supplied them and we asked landowners if we could put them up. We added Huby history to the leaflets to make them more interesting. After printing them on a home computer, we got a grant from the Parish Council for a print run. Income now pays for reprints.



NYCC asked us to look at Brown Moor Lane, a route to Skelton, and Sparrington Lane with Oxclose Lane, routes to Sutton. As major thoroughfares, they are on maps of 1771, 1806 and 1841 as 'ancient lanes'. We applied to clarify their usage and status, a legal process. Evidence about Brown Moor Lane was deposited at Council offices. We had no need to proceed for the other two lanes because the dates showed hundreds of years of usage. Also NYCC said they are all protected by being on the List of Streets, a legal document. So the rights-of-ways on these lanes are protected. This means that these lanes can be used like rights of way, as they always have been...

Winter at the Forest of Flowers, Huby



It's been a spectacular winter so far at our woodland and wildflower meadows, with crisp weather brightening up the place and lots of wildlife enjoying the habitat here in Huby.

We've been taking stock, including with our annual New Year Plant Hunt, which showed a record number of species in bloom. Our harvest mouse survey was also successful, with 8 nests found – a new record for the site and double last year's findings! Amazing to see this struggling species doing so well here at FoF.

Wisps o' the Willow!

Our 2026 volunteer sessions started brilliantly with groups of 10+ helping us each week. One of the main jobs has been harvesting from our willow coppice, cutting the lovely straight stems grown in the last year. Once cut, we stack all the material for it to dry, and we're hoping to use it for weaving in a few months' time.

Each week is different for our volunteers, who help every Monday 9.30 - 12.00 (with coffee and cake served afterwards as a thank you!). Tuesday 24 February: The Choral

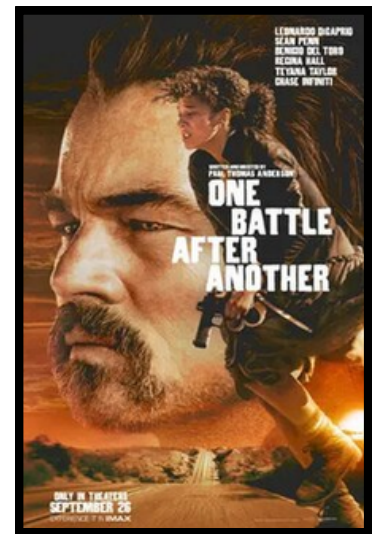
Written by Alan Bennett and directed by Nicholas Hytner. As war rages on the Western Front, the Choral Society in Ramsden, Yorkshire has lost most of its men to the army. The Choral's ambitious committee, determined to press ahead, decides to recruit local young males to swell their ranks. They must also engage a new chorus master, and despite their suspicions that he has something to hide, their best bet seems to be Dr Guthrie (Ralph Fiennes) – recently returned from a career in Germany. As conscription papers start to arrive, the whole community discovers that the best response to the chaos that is laying waste to their lives is to make music together.



Tuesday 24 March: One Battle After Another

One Battle After Another is a 2025 American black comedy action thriller directed by Paul Thomas Anderson. The film stars Leonardo DiCaprio, Sean Penn and Benicio del Toro. It follows an ex-revolutionary who is forced back into his former combative lifestyle when he and his daughter are pursued by a corrupt military officer.

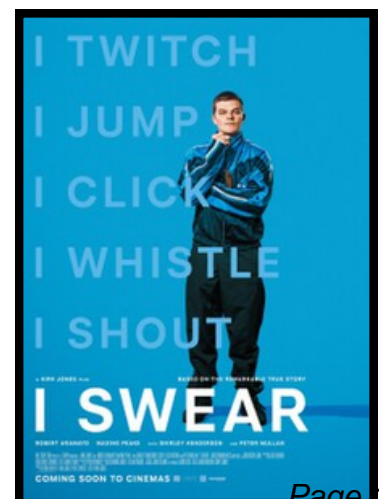

Kirk Jones's terrifically warm, generous film is about real-life activist John Davidson, who is from Galashiels in the Scottish Borders and has Tourette syndrome, with its tics, compulsive behaviour patterns and random obscene shouts. He was awarded an MBE in 2019 for his work educating the nation about the condition. I Swear contains a great performance from Robert Aramayo, full of intelligence and charm. This is an absorbing, compassionate film.
