Parish Council News

There are still currently two vacancies on the Parish Council. If you feel you would like to be co-opted on to the Council or would just like more information on the role then please do email the Clerk.

The Council met on Wednesday 13th May 2026 and on Wednesday 15th July 2026.

The first meeting was the Annual Meeting of the Council and Cllr John Corden was elected as Chairman and Cllr Jemma Dale was elected as Vice-Chairman.

- An annual grant was agreed towards the upkeep of the cemetery at All Hallows Church which is used by Huby parishioners.
- A one off grant was made to the Huby Playground Appeal. It was agreed to start the process of registering Tally Hill as village green. This would give a further level of protection to this very important recreational space in the village.
- The provision of a phone mast to give coverage to the village was now unlikely to be implemented until at least 2030 and the matter would again be taken up with the Member of Parliament. The withdrawal of the copper phone lines would mean that this mobile service becomes a vital emergency backup in the event of a power outage.
- Six planning applications were considered across both meetings.

Over the last few years, the Parish Council has received CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) payments when certain developments have been built. If you feel that your club or organisation has a project that would improve the infrastructure of the Parish then please see the grants policy on the website and complete a grant application form for the Council to consider.

The next meeting is scheduled to be held on Wednesday 9 September 2026 at 7pm in the Village Hall. Please check the website for the agenda in early September.

This prestigious accolade was awarded in recognition of the commitment, dedication and community spirit shown by the many volunteers who make the shop such a success.



While we are incredibly proud of this achievement, the future success of the shop depends on continuing to attract new volunteers. Summer Term

The summer holidays are finally here, bringing to a close another busy and memorable half term at Huby C of E Primary School.

As many of you will know, we are incredibly fortunate to have our own swimming pool here at school. Over the past couple of years, it has benefited from significant improvements, thanks to the generosity, fundraising and hard work of volunteers from our wonderful village community.



Our swimming programme is now in full swing, with every pupil swimming, on average, three times each week. Alongside developing their swimming ability, children are learning valuable water safety and lifesaving skills while building confidence and resilience in the water. Unsurprisingly, this has been especially popular during the recent spell of hot weather, with pupils thoroughly enjoying the opportunity to cool off while continuing to learn.

Our children have also enjoyed a fantastic range of extra-curricular opportunities this half term. Our youngest and oldest pupils have embraced the challenges of Forest Quest, developing teamwork, resilience and a love of the outdoors, while the whole school enjoyed a tennis taster day, giving everyone the chance to learn new skills, stay active and, for many, discover a new sporting interest.



Pupils from across the school have also enjoyed visits to the Easingwold Birds of Prey Centre, where they had the opportunity to learn about a fascinating range of birds and their habitats. We are incredibly grateful to the centre for generously providing free admission, helping to make this memorable experience possible for so many of our children.

Our year 5 pupils enjoyed a languages morning at Outwood Academy, where they had the chance to meet and spend time with the language teachers and students, having lessons in French and Spanish with other schools from around the area, as well as enjoy a lunch at Outwood before coming home. For lots of our pupils this was their first chance to see the secondary school, so a very exciting and informed morning was had by all.

Our year 5 and 6 students entered an anti-bullying poetry competition, run by the North Yorkshire Police. We were thrilled to see all of their entries in a published book and every child was presented with a copy and a certificate, by representatives from North Yorkshire Police.



Some of our year 4 boys have run an art competition recently in school to raise money for the charity Pets as Therapy. Alfie, our PAT dog, visits every Monday (with Stuart) and listens to the children read.

The themes of the art competition were Pets, Wildlife and Transport and they raised £43.50. Well done, boys!

Our Key Stage 2 pupils brought the summer term to a spectacular close with their production of Pirates of the Curry Bean. We could not be prouder of the commitment, enthusiasm and talent that every child brought to the performance.

Not only did every pupil play an important role on stage, but many also contributed behind the scenes through the creation of props, set design and the countless rehearsals that brought the show to life. From learning lines and songs to perfecting costumes (with plenty of support from parents and carers) it was a true team effort and a wonderful example of our school community working together.

This year, the production took place at Huby Village Hall, providing the space and facilities to make the performance even more memorable. We are incredibly fortunate to have such a fantastic venue at the heart of our village, and we are grateful for the opportunity to use it. The performances were a tremendous success, and our pupils should be immensely proud of everything they achieved.

Our PTA have been working as hard as ever to raise much needed funds for the school. As a voluntary group, they contribute considerably towards enriching the lives of our students, during their time at school, not only financially, but also by creating memorable experiences for the whole school. This half term they held a wonderful Colour Run for our pupils (and some enthusiastic teachers too!) as well as the annual school disco, not forgetting their famous Ice Lolly Fridays. As a result of their hard work, they have most recently funded a very popular make-over of brightly coloured markings on our playground that the children are thoroughly enjoying.

Our waiting list is getting quite LONG!

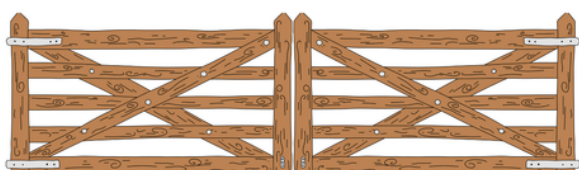

I write this whilst looking out upon a brown lawn dotted with clover. In my previous message I hoped that you were able to get out into your garden on one of the few fine days. This time I trust you are sitting in the shade during the day and only venturing out to water pots and deadhead flowers after 8 pm. My dreams of a beautiful garden have literally turned to dust.

The club have had some enjoyable outings over the last few months thanks to Hilary's organising skills. The first was a coach trip to Burnby Hall for their Tulip Festival. Colourful gardens, knowledgeable guide and tasty teas, what's not to enjoy!

Next, there was an afternoon visit to Swindon House Farm where a young lady had created a wonderful garden and wildflower meadow in just a few years. The stone farmhouse sat amongst breathtaking views near Harewood. The scones with strawberries and elderflower cream were simply the best.

At the end of June we had an evening visit to Shandy Hall. We started with a guided tour of the church (I am determined to return and spend much longer there as there is so much history to uncover) followed by a tour of the gardens (Herbaceous borders and wildflower meadow and pond) and the house. Again, so much history of the house and its contents to discover. Thankfully, knowledgeable guides were on hand to answer a myriad of questions and point us towards hidden gems (such as the medieval wall paintings).

The biennial Open Gardens event took place in Sutton-on-the-Forest at the end of May. There were 11 open gardens to visit as well as teas in the village hall, plant sale, brass band, stained glass demonstration, and singer. The gardens opened before we had this heatwave so looked at their best. I was busy with the plant sale so did not get round all of them. It was an exhausting 2 days but, as well as the gardeners, I must thank the YCA for teas in the Village Hall, Club members and Young Farmers for setting things out (including marquees) and putting things away, and everyone who supplied plants for sale. A special mention goes to Brown's Nurseries who came to our aid at the 11th hour. Let me also mention our treasurer, Derek, who organised the event and worked tirelessly to ensure its success.



We raised £2000 for each of the 2 chosen charities, St Leonard's Hospice and Alzheimer's Society, as well as well as donations to several local good causes.

But we do not have to wait 2 years to see other people's gardens as the Club are visiting 4 Hubby gardens in July. I just hope the other gardens are not as baked as mine. We are also using it as a chance to say thank you to all the open gardeners of Sutton.

If you want to join us, the Club will be starting their season of meetings with guest speakers in September. We will publish a programme and put up notices around the villages so watch out for the posters.

Summer at the Forest of Flowers, Huby



Summer has been fantastic here at our meadows and new woodland, with a huge range of flora and fauna out in full swing! Our orchids have been incredible, with the Common Spotted Orchid (pictured) becoming more widespread each year. Oxeye Daisies have been booming, with their bright flowers across huge swathes of the site. The meadows are incredibly diverse, with Hedge Bedstraw, Meadowsweet and legumes (like Bird's-foot Trefoil, Tufted Vetch, Red Clover) all creating a stunning and vibrant display.

Our honey bees are happy, with such an abundant supply of nectar. June saw us complete our first harvest of the year, with more honey than expected! It's turned out to be delicious and very popular. **Thank you to all who support us by buying it at Huby & Sutton Community Shop.**

We've seen wildlife in abundance, with the heatwave bringing a huge emergence of butterflies and dragonflies. We also have Green Woodpeckers nesting on-site and Barn Owls too.

Wildflower Seed Harvest

Our seed harvest is in full swing and we've been busy hand-collecting from lots of species, including Yellow Rattle, Red Campion and Oxeye Daisy. The next sowing season (Sept - Oct) brings an opportunity for everyone to support biodiversity in the area by growing wildflowers. Visit our website or get in touch if you'd like some of our locally-grown seed! We also supply our own wildflower plugs and potted plants, with free delivery to nearby villages, or collection welcome.

An Eventful Time

Summer is the perfect time to share the 100-acre habitat, with the wildflowers out in all their glory. We hosted Wildflower Walks and ID courses, Open Farm Sunday, and a number of local clubs and private tours as well. Overall, around 200 visitors came to our events in June alone!



Our wide-ranging events calendar continues, allowing us to share the amazing 100-acre habitat with visitors Tea, coffee and homemade cakes included at all events.

Tuesday 8 September: Power Ballad

Once again, Irish writer-director John Carney delivers an aspartame rush of enjoyment with this terrific comedy of bromance and betrayal in the world of music, starring Nick Jonas (from the Jonas Brothers) as Danny Wilson, a preeningly insecure ex-boyband superstar trying to go solo and searching for a hit single, and Paul Rudd as Rick Power, a washed up wedding-singer who rashly plays Danny a catchy song he's been working on. *Power Ballad* is about making it and dreaming big, about every busker never giving up on hopes of one day being mega. But as so often with Carney, it's about something else, usually left unacknowledged in movies about music or any sort of showbusiness: the terrible binary of success and failure. *Guardian*



Tuesday 13 October: Hunt for the Wilderpeople

It's a coming-of-age tale - a troubled teenager finding his place in the world deep in the mountains, with a man who never thought he'd be a father figure. Waititi's film defies its convention through grounded characters, witty dialogue, compassionate filmmaking and inventive storytelling. *Hunt for the Wilderpeople* is consistently clever and even moving. It's proof that we'll keep listening to the familiar stories if they're this well-told. *Ebert*

We thought we'd show this partly in memory of Sam Neill, a very talented and charming actor who recently died.
